Voting held for choosing the spirit vendor and fund approval for the requested proposal. The next meeting has been scheduled for November 15th, with a pre-meeting planned to set the agenda.

## 2. Principal's report

• As the QMack show was a great success, Jodie booked it again for another workshop to be held on Feb 29<sup>th</sup>.

• They received the photo preview today and few kids have taken them home and the rest will be taking home tomorrow.

• Principal presented the EQAO results and same to be included in the minutes. The school has adjusted the time of their second nutrition break to be half an hour later in order to maximize learning while students are at their freshest.

## 3. Funding request proposal for PhysEd Equipment

• Proposal is attached for reference

• A Funding request proposal for \$1500/- to support the purchase of PhysEd equipment from Mr. Snyder and couple other teachers were presented. The request is to purchase the things like smaller dodge balls, cricket and pickleball sets, hula hoops and other items. There was a concern about the status of the funds and the previous treasurer's report was reviewed to approve the request. Voting was done and with a 100% motion funding proposal was approved.

## 4. Book Fair

• The Book Fair is planned for display on Nov 23<sup>rd</sup>. Preview is on Nov 24<sup>th</sup> and the purchases are open to students on Nov 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> from 8am to 5pm. Nov 28<sup>th</sup> it will open from 9am to noon. Nov 30<sup>th</sup> book fair will be taken off and like last year the collected funds will be given to the teachers to buy supplies or books from the scholastic site for their classrooms.

• A mail will be sent out to the council and parents for volunteering in the book fair.

## 5. Treasurer's Report

• Currently, the council has a total of \$11,758, including a WEFI of \$435. Approval of \$1500/for PhyEd equipment and \$300/- for spirit wear purchases has to be updated in the expenses.

## 6. Spirit Wear Campaign

• Ivy, Menlinda, Vaidhehi, and Hanan presented the quotes for spirit wear from three vendors. The council discussed the pros and cons for the quotes like availability of online purchases, quality and variations of the products available, affordability and the amount of work involved for the school secretary and the need of volunteers. Voting was done and decided to proceed with Purple Shark vendor with 100% motion.

• A request for \$300/- from the school council was approved with 100% motion to support the families in need of help to purchase the spirit wear.

• A request was made to share the presentation deck and decided to include in the minutes and same is included for reference.

## 7. Next meeting and agenda

• The next meeting is scheduled for **November 15th** and the chair, treasurer, and Jodie will have a quick online meeting about a week before to put the agenda together.

## Principal's Report for School Council Wednesday, October 18th, 2023

## <u>School</u>

We had an amazing whole-school show with QMack on September 22<sup>nd</sup>. He was an incredibly engaging speaker and performer and wowed us with his basketball tricks, sense of humour and feats like balancing a 100 lb. bench on his chin and doing the same with a 10-foot ladder. He taught us about character attributes as well like attitude, leadership, love, self-control, teamwork, accountability, and respect. At some point, I'd like to bring QMack back to Abe Erb to do hands-on class basketball workshops with all the students.

November 13<sup>th</sup> is an upcoming Professional Activity Day and there will be no school for students. The focus of WRDSB staff learning for that day will be shared on our website closer to the date.

All elementary students will receive a progress report card (grades 1 - 6) on November  $20^{\text{th}}$ . As has been the pattern for the last few years, there is no specific day set aside for parent-teacher interviews. However, families are welcome to reach out to their child(ren)'s teachers at any point during the year to discuss their child(ren)'s progress.

We had great weather for our annual Terry Fox Run on September 27<sup>th</sup>. A total of \$792 was graciously donated by our Abe Erb families to support the Terry Fox Foundation. The staff and students had a great time, got some exercise, and even had a chance to visit with one of our mascots who made a surprise visit!

Our photo day on October 4<sup>th</sup> went smoothly. We are awaiting the proofs, which will be sent home with student for families to be able to order photo packages if they wish. Photo retake day for anyone who was absent on Oct 4<sup>th</sup> or not happy with their original photos will be held on November 8<sup>th</sup>.

We are excited to share that we will be hosting a Winter Variety Show (our first one since 2019!) Classes will be working together, and all students will have the opportunity to perform. We will be having 2 shows on Thursday, December 21<sup>st</sup> at 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. to give families some flexibility with which they are able to attend. A "save the date" announcement was sent out on School Day and more reminders will follow as we get closer to the date.

### <u>Board</u>

WRDSB Facilities Services has continued to implement a range of strategies to improve ventilation with the goal of reducing the spread of illness. This work was completed in partnership with the Ministry of Education and utilizing available provincial, federal and Board of Trustees approved funding. More details are available in the full report on the WRDSB website.

The Parent Involvement Committee (PIC) is looking for new members. Parents and caregivers of students in any WRDSB schools are welcome to apply to be a member. As a member of PIC, you have an opportunity to strengthen parent/caregiver partnership in education and be part of a committee dedicated to helping each student achieve their full potential. The committee collaborates with WRDSB staff to support, encourage and enhance parent engagement in children's education, in order to improve student achievement and well-being. PIC has a supportive relationship with the Waterloo Region Assembly of Public-School Councils (WRAPSC) but is a separate group. WRAPSC brings together school council representatives from across the Waterloo Region, whereas PIC is mandated by the Ministry of Education and supports the WRDSB with the voice of caregivers. #### **Province**

The results of the 2023 EQAO testing were made public on October 12<sup>th</sup>. This was our second year of having grade 3s and grade 6s participate in the new digital version of the testing. Anyone who is interested can access results from all schools in Ontario through the EQAO website. I created a one-page summary of our results from Abraham Erb and it will be included in the minutes from this meeting. I will also paste a link to the document in the chat box so that anyone attending the online meeting can see the summary now. We are pleased that our students continue to perform very well in Reading, Writing and Math, and we are continuously aiming to develop best practice instruction in all our classrooms.

## Wednesday, October 18, 2023

On October 25th, the Grade 3/4 FI and Grade 4/5 FI classes will be visiting the University of Waterloo to take part in their Engineering Science Quest program. They'll engage in a campus tour and participate in STEM workshop experiences.

## **Proposal for Phys Ed Equipment**

"Physical inactivity is a serious health issue for Canadian children and youth. The Ontario government created the Daily Physical Activity (DPA) policy, which requires school boards to ensure that all elementary students have a minimum of 20 minutes of sustained moderate to vigorous physical activity each school day during instructional time." (Public Health Ontario).

Physical Education class is just as important as any other class, whether language or math or science. In order to provide quality phys-ed lessons, it is important to have the resources necessary to teach. By updating and improving the phys-ed equipment at Abraham Erb, we hope to improve students' abilities and enthusiasm for Phys Ed class. Having a variety of equipment and supplies will allow educators the opportunity to provide quality lessons, and focus on new lessons, in turn keeping students more engaged in being active along with being able to meet a variety of needs and interests. It will also help us to diversify programs away from traditional sports that some students may not be interested in. Therefore, we are requesting a sum of \$1500 from the School Council to aid us in improving the Physical Education program at Abraham Erb.







  - The vendor requires a minimum order but has expressed interest in collaborating with the parent council and school on the order quantity
  - Parent council will have to create flyers and work with the school to collect the order details and money and package each order

## **Quote#3 – Purple Shark**

- Pros.:
  - Offers reasonably priced products and served as the vendor for the previous spirit wear
  - Capable of setting up the website for individual purchases
- Cons.:
  - Comparatively more expensive than Vendor #2

- During the last round of the Spirit Wear campaign, the school council contributed \$200-\$300 to families in need (in the form of voucher) enabling them to make purchases – I suggest we run this initiative again this year.
