Principal Update

SIPSA - Math

- We continue to work on conceptual fluency with frequent number strings and math talks. As we learn more, we are working to be more purposeful why this lesson with these kids now? Overall, there has been a very positive impact on student learning.
- Mrs. Fraser and Mrs. Williamson are our math leads and Ms Givlin also attends the junior sessions. The primary focus has been on addition and subtraction and the junior on fractions. Ms Givlin also attends sessions for administrators.
- Our primary students continue to work on DreamBox for at least an hour each week. Kudos to parents who are supporting further practice at home.

SIPSA - Wellbeing

- In our first year we have focused on the data from SCIS survey to improve student feelings of safety in the washrooms with success. We find we need to maintain focus with announcements and teacher reminders so we don't slip back into old patterns. We love that more students are speaking up and helping out when others forget.
- We are focussing on meeting sensory needs. We have a calming room and many bins with calming tools. We have purchased 2 exercise bike/desks for older students and have placed them in 2 classes. The bikes are for all students to use and after an initial adjustment time for the class have been very successful and well used.
- Our goal is to purchase light covers, 2 primary bikes and a small trampoline next.
- As staff we are currently working to clarify our well-being focus in the same way we
 narrowed our math focus. We feel strongly about honouring student voice and
 empowering students to speak up in situations where they feel less safe (i.e., on the
 playground, in the lunchroom and in the washrooms)

Technology

 Mrs. Lawson and Ms Givlin attended the GAFE Summit. Two jam packed days of learning about all things tech. Google classroom, how to share our school's story, effective Google searches, use of Google forms, different apps ... the list goes on.

- Mrs. Fraser attended a session on coding. Mrs. Marschall, Mrs. Williamson, Mrs.
 Hachey and Mrs. Fraser started a grade 4 coding club last Friday with almost all
 students attending. Kids are learning alongside teachers and helping one another and
 embracing the challenge. We currently have 3 Spheros and plan to purchase more.
- We have invited experts to support our learning Heidi Mannhardt and Elke Baumgartner from WRDSB are helping us to learn about coding and Google forms.
- Miss Kittel, Mrs. Lawson, Mrs. Fraser and Ms Givlin attended the WRDSB Digital Literacy Symposium this week.

EQAO

- Grades 3 and 6 teachers have been working hard to prepare students for the
 upcoming Primary and Junior Assessments. Students are familiar with the question
 types and are learning to really read questions. They are learning to complete their
 own calculations and then check the answers provided in the multiple choice
 questions.
- We have purchased 20 scientific calculators as calculator use is permitted on all of the junior assessment and most of the primary.

Parent Engagement

- Kudos to parent council for an awesome movie night. The gym was full once again and many positive comments were offered.
- Kudos to Miss Hughes and Ms Whistance, our Earth Week team, for organizing a fantastic week of activities ending with the family picnic on Friday. The weather kept us inside but staff loved the feeling of togetherness in the gym.
- We have 98% of our students linked to parent email on **SchoolDay**.
- Our **Twitter** followers have almost doubled from the beginning of the year. We began with 106 and are currently at 209.
- Our new **Instagram** account has 83 followers.
- Parent council chairs have reached out to parents via a Google form survey. As of this
 morning we had 25 responses.
- All parents have been asked to complete the SCIS survey on line.

Grants

- We have been successful in our applications for Rotary and WEFI grants to support off-campus learning experiences.
