Principal's Update

- 1. Thanks to Mrs Mahon we are registered with mabelslabels.ca This is not a fundraiser but an attempt to have fewer items in our lost and found. Parents and students are encouraged to come and check the items in the lost and found. Items left at the end of the year will be donated to charity.
- 2. Thanks to the SHYFT program, some of our students are busy trying to organize a fundraiser to support Sick Kids. We are proud of their initiative and look forward to support from our community. More details will follow.
- 3. The Community Pancake Breakfast was a huge success we had our largest turnout ever with some people needing to sit along the floor. We are grateful to have raised \$180 for Nutrition for Learning thanks to community donations. Our staff team lead by Miss Dunbar is amazing and we appreciate the shopping, cooking, set up, clean up and early morning start to make this event possible.

Our focus on developing HERO Generation attributes in our students and ourselves continues many parents took the time to read the messages our students wrote on their Optimism Suns which were on display in the gym during the breakfast. Our next focus is on Resilience. Parents can look for materials to come home soon. Jim Moss, Chief Happiness Officer and founder of Plasticity will be at Alpine on April 10 to talk to staff and then to talk to parents at 6:30 p.m. about the why and how of developing HERO traits. These are important life skills and they can help our students do better and feel better at school too.

- 6. *I am Sheriauna* thanks to council for providing this inspiring visit. Two classes have written thank you letters to council (pictures on Twitter) as they were truly inspired by Sheriauna. This was a great learning opportunity for all of us.

Student safety is a shared responsibility and each community member must do his/her part. We are deeply grateful to the majority of families who do make student safety a priority.
- 8. Late arrivals we are grateful to our families who pause and participate with us in our opening exercises including O Canada, announcements and our mindful breathing. Thanks to the majority of our students who arrive on time and ready to learn.
- 9. If anyone is aware of any kindie students for next year who have not yet registered, please ask them to register as soon as possible. Class sizes are based upon actual enrolment (first set of numbers have just been sent in) so it is best for everyone if we know now.
