Principal's Update

- Sincere thanks go out to our loyal, generous, fun, and hard-working school council
 members who make our special events possible. We very much appreciate that you
 consistently go above and beyond and donate your time and talents. Your guidance
 on school matters is greatly valued.
- We successfully had everyone out and accounted for in less than 3 minutes at our recent fire drills. Our students and staff are awesome!
- Pizza prices will rise to \$2.00 per slice next year and only one reminder will be sent. Incomplete orders (e.g., payment not received by the deadline) will not be processed. This will allow the process to run more smoothly and hopefully increase proceeds to support more school initiatives. Many thanks to our neighbor, Denise Vogel, and to parent, Jennifer McCuaig, for being awesome pizza day volunteers!
- Increased support from parents and guardians is needed to make trips run smoothly.
 In addition to the considerable time spent planning, booking buses, and completing paperwork, teachers are spending a great deal of time trying to track down permission forms, payment, and volunteers.
- Our Lexia data is showing strong results: almost all of our 20 students who used the
 program this year have made greater than 1 year of progress in just over 8 months,
 staff and students are seeing improvement in literacy skills as measured by PM
 Benchmark data, and most students are enjoying using the program and want to use it
 again in the fall. We are having a few students new to Lexia try the program over the
 summer. Students already using Lexia who indicated interest are also able to use
 Lexia over the summer.
- Our DreamBox data is also very positive. Our students increased their growth this
 year over last, which had also increased significantly from the previous year.
 DreamBox is also available for all students to use over the summer. Some of our
 students are making incredible use of this learning tool.
- Students are loving the Little Library thanks to Mrs. W-G and her family for building and installing the library. Books are moving quickly. Summer reading is very important this is another step which we hope will help us to improve student literacy growth.
- 31 of approximately 220 families responded to our communication survey. This is not

- a large enough sample for valid results. Overall, respondents love SchoolDay!
- The school purchased a pop-up shelter for students going to track and field which we anticipate will be used at many other events.
- Our goal is to make Alpine PS an inviting community hub and we want everyone to be able to enjoy our lovely facility. Ideally, everyone will take great care of our property. Sadly, this does not always happen; for example, within 2 days of the mud kitchen arriving, someone worked quite hard to remove the taps and bent the faucet leaving sharp edges which would hurt little hands so now our sink has no taps.
