Principal's Update

• Our Allie Traits focus for November has been on Resilience. Our Resilience Team (Mr. Ottogalli, Mrs. Ramdehal, Miss Dunbar and their classes) organized a beautiful Remembrance Day Assembly reflecting on the resilience shown by those people who live through a war. Highlights included the beautiful student artwork and the What Peace Means To Me video created by Miss Dunbar featuring our very own students. Our junior students researched famous people including JK Rowling, Lebron James, Misty Copeland, and Martin Luther King and then shared how those individuals needed to be resilient on the daily announcements. They have created a Gotcha bulletin board and slips which are intended to encourage our students to notice when their classmates are showing resilience. We are getting a great deal of positive feedback about the inspiring songs the team is playing to also reinforce the resilience message. I heard a lovely story from a parent who attended one of the trips and purposefully created an opportunity to get to know one of the students he has seen struggling. The parent was struck by how appreciative, polite, and interesting the student was when they had time to talk on the bus ride. - Thanks to Mrs. Lawson for arranging visits from the **Humane Society** which

are always popular with our students (and principal)! Thanks to Mrs. Becker, Healthy Beginnings and Kindergarten in Nature in Alpine Forest programming has also occurred here at the school this month. Mrs. Becker and Mrs. Lawson are very excited about the learning possibilities and our kids love being in the forest.

- Staff have been involved in professional learning during our staff meeting, PA Day session, and WrapAround/site-based days with our consultant, John Lee. Our teachers are reflective, eager to learn, collaborative, and want to do an incredible job for our students. We are working on asking the more challenging thinking and application questions in math, improving our awareness and actions to make Alpine more equitable, and using MathUp, DreamBox and Lexia as effectively as possible. All teachers whose students are using Lexia have also had training. Thanks to our awesome teachers our students are doing great on Lexia and DreamBox!
- Kudos to the families who manage to have students work on Lexia and DreamBox at home. We recognize that not all of our students have access and are committed to using both programs very well at school. But, the extra time can make an amazing difference for the students who do have access.
