Our School

Bluevale Collegiate Institute (BCI) opened in 1972 under the direction of Principal Robert Chilton, who envisioned a new, exciting environment in which students could learn and grow. Today, Bluevale builds on that initial vision. It has a well-deserved reputation for excellence in academics, athletics, arts and activities. Bluevale believes in a balance between the classroom and activities, creating a fun, exciting place to explore and grow, while preparing for the future. Bluevale serves East Waterloo as part of the Waterloo Region District School Board. Bluevale's feeder schools are: Lester B. Pearson P.S., Lincoln Heights P.S., and Margaret Avenue P.S.

Bluevale is a semestered school. There are four, 75- minute periods each day and students enjoy a common one hour lunch break.

Bluevale is a community of students, teachers, support staff and parents working together in pursuit of growth, awareness and responsibility. It is the aim of the Bluevale community to encourage, guide and assist all of its members:

- in their commitment to academic and extracurricular activities;
- in the development of a pleasant learning atmosphere;
- in the making of responsible decisions and in the acceptance of the consequences of such decisions;
- in the development of intellectual, physical, creative, emotional, social and moral needs;

Bluevale's facilities are well maintained and include: three gyms, two playing fields, four tennis courts, a track, a fully-equipped weight room, fitness room, an auto shop, a machine shop, a communications technology lab, an outdoor classroom and greenspace; and just completed, the Bluevale Free Inclusive Training (BFIT) Park, an outdoor training facility, adjacent to the tennis courts.

In March of 2010, renovations began at Bluevale. Since that time, the school has seen the addition of a new wing containing 18 classrooms, a fully equipped photography darkroom, eight science labs, two visual art labs, a family studies lab complete with four kitchens, a special education area, improved computer labs, fitness room, communications technology lab and a spacious library. Additionally, the school has WiFi throughout the building.
