1. Book Fair – Scholastic – guest speaker: Dani Stewart

- February 7-14; running 11th-13th; 4 cases will be dropped off
- 537 books purchased last Spring which is approximately 2.31 books per student
- Book Fair training available on line if interested
- we will be given \$60 of promotional allowance – All Star theme this year – eg. Of 12 stars worth \$5.
- special value box to be used potentially for lower income families to access – we are to use at our discretion
- Adopt a book program where a table is set up and parents can see what books would be available to purchase to donate to the school if they wish.
- book talk in a box – to be used as a draw into a specific book , will use these as part of the announcements
- author video which includes authors talking about books and celebrities talking about the importance of reading/literacy
- re-order should be done by 2 p.m. before the pick up day – can be faxed in or done on-line
- Alicia is our go – to person for the Scholastic should we need assistance or help
- Lynn Robb is our co-ordinator for the event
- Lynn to write a letter inviting new kindergarten students to the school to the fair
- everyone present at the meeting is considered to be a “book fair specialist”
