
### PART A: CAREER PLANNING

# PART B: APPLICATIONS- HOW TO APPLY

- •For university Apply using the online
  - 101 Application
- •To login, you will need your school number and PIN (these usually arrive at our school by early November)
- Be sure to use your legal name
- For college you will create an account at ontariocolleges.ca
- •Check your email frequently!

- UNIVERSITY:
- 3 applications = \$150.00
- Each additional application = \$50.00
- Students may apply to a maximum of three (3) program choices at <u>one</u> university. You may apply to as many universities as you like.
- Be sure to research if the university provides "alternate offers" of admission.
- Payment can be made using a credit card or online banking.

#### UNIVERSITY:

- Applicants will pay for all program choices.
- If an applicant drops a choice and replaces it with a new choice, the new choice will incur a charge.
- The only exception is if an applicant drops a choice and adds a new choice at the same university.

#### UNIVERSITY:

- Applicants will pay for all program choices.

- · COLLEGE:
- 5 applications = \$95.
- Students may apply to a maximum of three program choices at any one college.
- Payment can be made by credit card (Visa, MasterCard, or American Express), online banking, or mail (certified cheque or money order).

# PART D: UNIVERSITY TIMELINES

- January 15, 2020 deadline for Ontario secondary school students to submit online applications to OUAC – apply early!
- February 4, 2020 recommended last date for students to submit all information to the OUAC including university and program changes.
- Note: This is a recommended deadline. The OUAC will still accept and process changes at any time. Changes should made in consultation with the university.

# PART D: UNIVERSITY TIMELINES

- May 27, 2020 the latest date by which all secondary school applicants can expect a response from an Ontario university.
  - Offers will be <u>conditional</u> upon successful completion of the OSSD including required courses, successful completion of the OSSLT, and 40 hours of community service. Universities expect students to maintain (close to) their current overall average.

# PART D: UNIVERSITY TIMELINES

• June 1, 2020 - the earliest date by which Ontario universities may require a response to an offer of admission and a financial commitment (e.g. registration deposit, residence deposit, etc).

### PART D: COLLEGE TIMELINES

- In order to be given equal consideration, all applications must be received by February 1, 2020.
- After that time, students can still apply and their applications will be reviewed on a firstcome, first-served basis.
- Highly competitive programs will no longer be an option.

### PART D: COLLEGE TIMELINES

- Early October 2019 Online Application Opens
- February 1, 2020 Equal Consideration Date
- February 1, 2020 Earliest Offer Date
- May 1, 2020 Deadline to Confirm Offers of Admission – colleges may extend offers of admission after this date
- June 2020 Tuition Deposit Due

### PART E: UNIVERSITY MARK REPORTING

- Late in the admission process, admission averages are calculated using the top 6 grade 12 courses – as defined by a "4U" or "4M" in the course code (e.g. ENG4UI), however, most universities require pre-requisite courses in the admission average calculation.
- Early in the admission process, some universities calculate averages by **including grade 11** and 12 marks.

### PART E: MARK REPORTING (CONT'D)

- When applying to universities outside of Ontario, students apply directly to the university.
- OUAC will forward Ontario transcripts (using your OUAC Reference number) to the following universities: Acadia, Bishop, UBC, Simon Fraser, Concordia, Dalhousie, McGill, SFU, U of Victoria, and U of Calgary.
- Students must request to have IB and Ontario transcripts sent to out-ofprovince/country universities.

## PART E: COLLEGE MARK REPORTING

- Colleges receive all high school marks.
- Admission averages are calculated for all competitive programs.
- Non-competitive programs accept students who have the required pre-requisites.

### PART F: SCHOLARSHIPS

- Apply early!
- Be sure to visit the scholarship websites listed on the CHCI Guidance webpage and updated regularly on Gr.12 Google Classroom.
- If you need a reference letter from teachers or coaches, please give them ample notice and provide background information about you (as well as details about the scholarship you are applying for).
  - \*See Mrs Little in Guidance for more info on scholarships!

### PART F: SCHOLARSHIPS:

- Do not assume that you are ineligible for scholarships because you may not be at the top of your class. There are many scholarships that have very specific criteria that may apply to you perhaps based on gender, community involvement, ethnicity, etc.
- In some cases, students are able to access scholarships through their parents' employers.
- Depending on a student's mid-term and final grades, most universities will automatically offer money through Entrance Scholarships.

- If you are applying to college, you can go online and create a new application in October.
- If you are applying to university, the PIN numbers will soon be available in the Guidance Office. You will be required to show photo identification when picking up your PIN number.
- Keep yourself organized! Keep an electronic and paper file folder with all of your application information such as: PIN number, reference number, offers of admission, scholarship info, etc.
- Spend the necessary time and energy researching university and college options – visit several campuses.

- Talk to people who are studying at various colleges and universities or recent graduates about their experience.
- Plan to submit your applications well in advance of the deadline. This alleviates the stress of last minute decisions or technical delays.

- Accepting one offer online will cancel any previous acceptances you have made but will not impact other offers of admission.
- Be intentional regarding the ranking you assign to each application at the same university. Smaller universities may only consider you for your first choice.
- After you accept your final offer, select your courses early and confirm your offer of residence before the deadline.

 Remember this is your starting point – you are not committing yourself to a lifelong decision.

 Seek support and feedback from your family, friends, guidance counsellor, classroom teachers, coaches and community contacts.
