## Grade 9 & 10 Courses

### Information and Communication Technology in Business (Open Level) BTT 10I or BTT 20I

This course is highly recommended for all students. It will help them develop the digital literacy skills necessary for success in a technologically driven society.

**Note:** A student can take this course in Grade 9 or Grade 10, but not in both years.

### Introduction to Business (Open Level) BBI 10I or BBI 20I

This fun course uses a variety of activities and methods to teach important personal business skills and to expose students to many aspects of business.

**Note:** A student can take this course in Grade 9 or Grade 10, but not in both years.

### Introduction to Programming (Open Level) ICS 20I

**Strong Math Skills Recommended**  
Learn about computer programming fundamentals and practices. Design programs in Turing and Visual Basic. Acquire the essentials to be an outstanding programmer.

## IB Business Elective

### Business Management (Standard Level)

This Group 3 International Baccalaureate credit explores the key characteristics of business organization and the business functions of human resource management, finance, accounting, marketing and operations management. Students will enroll in **BOH4MW and BBB4MW** in their **Grade 11 Year**.  
If interested, **BB11OI/2OI** is strongly recommended.

## What Courses Can I take in Grade 9?

### BTT 10I - Information and Communication Technology in Business

This course introduces students to the use of information technology in a business environment. Students will develop word processing, spreadsheet, database, desktop publishing, presentation software, and website design skills. The skills learned in this course will contribute to success in all business areas, as well as other subject areas.

### BBI 10I - Introduction to Business

Develop an understanding of the business world, including: accounting, marketing, information and communication technology, human resources, personal finance, entrepreneurship, production and the importance of ethics and social responsibility.

### ICS 20I - Introduction to Programming

This course is designed to introduce the user to computer programming fundamentals and practices. Students will develop logical thinking processes used in designing computer solutions to problems, write and test their own programs, in addition to learning about other key computer concepts.

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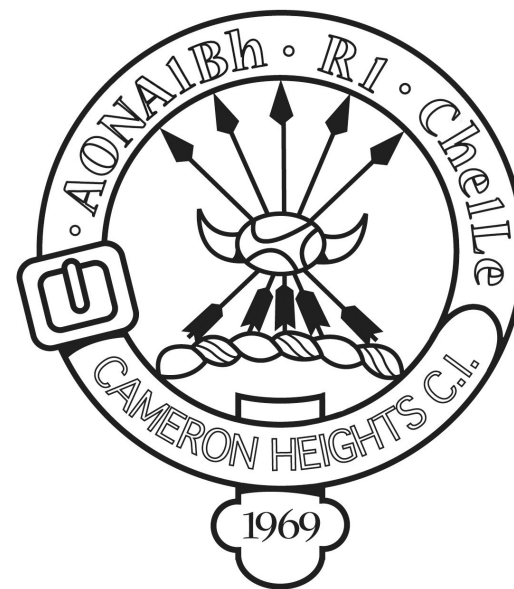
## BUSINESS CERTIFICATE
