#### Peanut Alert!

A new substitute peanut butter product is being marketed to consumers as a safe alternative for children to bring to schools in place of peanut butter.

The Waterloo Region District School Board asks that parents refrain from including these kinds of products in your child's lunches or snacks.

These products tend to look, taste, and smell very much like peanut butter. While the product is nut free, it mimics a known allergen that causes anaphylaxis in some children to the degree that it is indistinguishable from the allergen. It is a convincing substitute, opening up the possibility that it can be confused as peanut butter, or worse yet, peanut butter could be confused as this soy-based product.

The safety and health of our students is our first priority, which is why our schools have procedures in place to minimize risk of anaphylaxis reactions in our students. We sincerely appreciate your cooperation in avoiding the use of these products to assist in our continued efforts to create a safe, caring and inclusive learning environment for all students.

Open Up The Books!



Library Hours 9:00 to 2:50 (excluding nutrition breaks)

All students will require a planner (or something resembling a planner) to sign out library books. Students are allowed to sign out a book for 3 weeks after which time they will receive an overdue notice. Once a student has an overdue item from the library they will not be allowed to sign out a book until the book is returned or renewed.

Please supply your child with a plastic bag, big enough to hold large books, to keep in their backpack to protect the books. Damaged books cannot be placed back in the library and payment to replace the book will be required (\$5 or \$10 depending on the book). During library orientation, students were informed on what steps to take in the event a book is damaged.

#### International Languages

The International Languages program provides opportunities for students to learn a language at the elementary or secondary school (high school credit) level, at a variety of sites around the Region.

2014-2015 School Year Registration Procedure Classes begin on Saturday, September 13, 2014 and run until Saturday, June 13, 2015.

All classes for the 2014-2015 school year are offered subject to sufficient enrolment.

Students who miss the spring registration will be able to register for language classes that have sufficient enrolment at the school locations on Saturday mornings, starting September 6, 2014.

Elementary – students may start at any point throughout the school year. Students must be 4 years of age by December 31, 2014 to be eligible.

Secondary – credit classes will not accept new students after the 4th class (October 4, 2014). Attendance is critical for credit classes, and students who miss more than 4 classes during the year may not be eligible to earn their credit.

To Register, please bring:

Proof of Birth and Citizenship – one of the following:

a Canadian Birth Certificate or Baptismal Certificate

a Canadian Passport (not a Canada Visa within a passport)

Canadian Citizenship Card

Confirmation of Permanent residence Form 5292 or IMM100 (verified with a passport) Permanent Resident Card

A current CCS or Transcript (Secondary Credit Courses only) available from their day school guidance office.

Fees – There are no WRDSB tuition fees for elementary or secondary students. There may be a student fee assessed by the Parent Cultural Association. These fees vary by language groups. Adults – fees may apply in some situations, call (519) 885-0800 for more information.

Clemens Mill "School Improvement Plan" for 2014-2015	In an article by Carla Thomas McClure titled <u>The Benefits</u> <u>of Teacher Collaboration</u> , she states that "teacher collaboration and professional learning communities are frequently mentioned in articles and reports on school improvement. Schools and teachers benefit in a variety of ways when teachers work together. A small but growing body of evidence suggests a positive relationship between teacher collaboration and student achievement."

Students will receive descriptive feedback while working on collaborative tasks which promote student inquiry.
thinking."	Students and parents will become familiar with the terminology of "Learning Goal and Success Criteria" which will be used throughout the school. Examples of this may be found on Anchor Charts posted on the walls of the hallway and in all classrooms.
<i>How can you help your children achieve the Clemens Mill goal?</i>	Parents are encouraged to ask their children <b>what</b> they are learning each day (Learning Goals) and <b>how</b> do they know they are achieving it (Success Criteria).We are confident that this strategy, and other high yield strategies, will truly enhance our focus on Assessment For Learning.
