

### **Grade 8-9 Transition Information**

Centennial P.S. held a Grade 8-9 Info Night on Thursday, November 21st to provide general information about the transition to secondary school. Materials distributed at the meeting are available on our school web site: cnw.wrdsb.ca

In Grade 9, students attend the secondary school designated by their home address, unless continuing in an extended/immersion French program or applying to a specialized (magnet) program. Admission to magnet programs is based on application



and/or audition. To confirm a student's home secondary school, use School Finder at www.wrdsb.ca.

Secondary school information nights provide specific information about each school and its programs. Students and parents are strongly encouraged to attend these sessions. An updated information night schedule is available at our web site, or

Guidance staff will visit classrooms in December to confirm students' home schools and provide course calendars for families to review. Confirmation of students' intended high schools, and further information about course selection and teacher recommendations, will follow in January.

Students will select their Grade 9 courses using an online system. We anticipate that online course registration for Centennial students will take place the week of February 18, 2014.

### School Bus Reminders
