A successful first dance saw many original costumes. Swinging music was supplied by the "25th Hour".



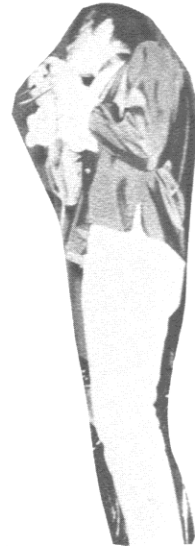
