A SPECIAL TRIBUTE TO **MR. TAYLOR**

Mr. Taylor is retiring this year after thirty-nine and a half years in the teaching profession. We felt it would be in order to relate to you some of the many achievements he has accumulated.

Mr. Taylor was originally from Chilliwack, British Columbia. At age fourteen he moved to Lythmore, Ontario, and attended Hagersville High School. After completing Hamilton Normal School in 1929-30 he taught two years at #12 and 16 Nover near Hagersville, and four and a half years at the Six

Nations Indian Reserve near Brantford before coming to Kitchener in 1937.

In Kitchener, Mr. Taylor taught seven years at King Edward School, one year at Courtland, and eight years at Victoria Public School where he taught grade nine mathematics. In 1954, when he completed his Bachelor of Arts Degree, he was appointed principal of Sunnyside School. As principal, Mr. Taylor served ten years at Sunnyside, one at Margaret Avenue and five years at Courtland.

The largest class he taught was fifty-three students in a grade five to eight situation on the Six Nations Indian Reserve.

When asked to relate his most unusual experience he laughed and said there were many, but related this one. Jim Quick, a grade four boy, was misbehaving while standing in line waiting to go into school. Mr. Taylor moved up behind him and put his hand on Jim's shoulder, Jim turned quickly and kicked Mr. Taylor on the shins with his heavy boots. When Jim realized what he had done he took off for home. Mr. Quick still lives in Kitchener and he and Mr. Taylor laugh about this experience each time they meet.

In addition to his work in the field of education, Mr. Taylor has contributed much to this community. He has always taken an active interest in sports in the Kitchener area, especially in the Minor and Senior Hockey and Baseball Organizations. He has just been honoured by the Mayor of the City of Kitchener for his twenty years of service as a member of the Parks and Recreation Commission, ten of which he acted as chairman. He is presently a member of his church's Board of Trustees.

In retirement, Mr. and Mrs. Taylor will reside in Niagara Falls, New York. They plan to spend their summers at a cottage at Lions Head and maybe (he says with a smile) their winters in Florida.

On behalf of all staffs and students, past and present, we express a sincere thanks to Mr. Taylor for his contribution to education and wish him the very best in his years of retirement.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

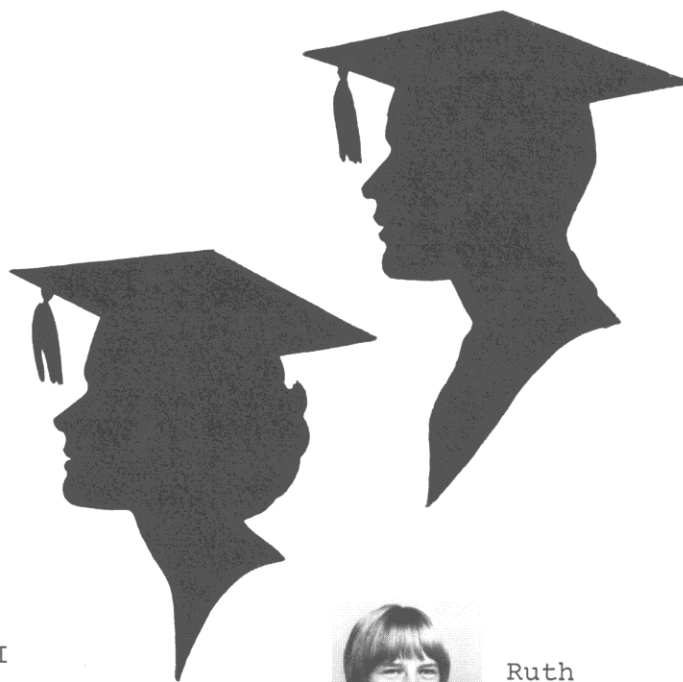
