Volunteer hours:

- Entered into MyBlueprint https://myblueprint.ca/ prior to the last week of school in June to be eligible to graduate in the current year.
- ➤ IMPORTANT!!! After June 30, when you become an inactive student, you MUST bring your proof of hours in to the Guidance Secretary or your hours will NOT BE counted for graduation.

Post-Secondary School Applications:

- Colleges: Students can create an account to apply in the fall
- Universities: Students get P.I.N. from Guidance to apply in fall
- Fill applications out PRIOR to deadlines and gather other information as needed
- □ Look into scholarships, bursaries and grants that you can apply for starting early September

Grad pictures:

- Grad pictures typically take place in February. Book your sitting in advance.
- If not taken at school, share a high-resolution copy with the yearbook teacher- see office for info.

Commencement (Graduation Ceremony):

- Create an account on <u>School Day</u> to register
- Through **School Day**, pay for your Commencement package

Get your P.I.N. in the fall and apply at https://www.ouac.on.ca/

Check your email and log-in REGULARLY to OCAS or OUAC to check the status of your application!

- You need to have ENG 4C as a minimum for most programs.
- Each program has its **own specific requirements**. It is your responsibility to
 make sure you meet them.
- The Ontario Colleges site contains information about programs and colleges, along with how to apply.
- You can apply to **5 programs** with a maximum of 3 at any one College.(See site for fee)

- You need <u>six 4U</u> or 4M credits, including a **4U English** credit, to apply.
- Make sure you **confirm the prerequisite courses** needed for the program.
- Get your P.I.N. (Personal Identification Number) to access the site from the Guidance office.
- University Information can be found at https://www.ontariouniversitiesinfo.ca/
- You can apply to **3 programs** for a base fee and pay extra for additional ones.

TRANSCRIPT INFO

You do not order transcripts when applying directly from high school to colleges or universities. High schools send it directly there.
