Staffing

- Two Reorganizations (one before students arrived)- we collapsed 5 classes and transitioned 5 staff to DL based on seniority. This is due to the board wide numbers of families selecting Distance Learning for their children.
- October 26- one more class collapsed and one staff member transitioned to DL
- Next re-organization will be in the new year and will be based on the survey to parents requesting changes in modes of learning. It will be effective Feb 15, 2021.
- VP Lori Williams is now a VP in Distance Learning
