Hi! I'm Jascha. I like sports. My favourite sport is volleyball. I play piano. This is my first year on the newsletter team. My favourite subject is lunch.





The Empire library space is being used as a staff planning and lunch room because of physical distancing requirements. Staff have been signing out books from the Library Clerk to use in their classroom.

Mrs. Thompson is back as the Library Clerk, after a leave, and is very gradually returning to work. Mobile library cart sign out service will start for students soon.

To get library services started, Mrs. Thompson has made Class Reading Bins filled with new books, picture books, early readers, chapter books, graphic format books, non-fiction books, magazines and French language books. Classes are welcome to order a carefully curated Class Reading Bin.





Mrs. Thompson and friends have looked at many of the new books that arrived last spring and this fall. Many new books have been included in the Class Reading Bins. Library Services at the Education Centre, chooses, buys and sends new books to the Empire library several times a year.

The Empire library has a large non-fiction section. This section has books about birds!

Mrs. Thompson has been providing curriculum-based books for teachers and classes, for example, books about rocks, minerals, migration, gears and butterflies.





Mrs. Thompson, with help, updated the bulletin boards with posters, and she made a huge display of books for Orange Shirt and Truth and Reconciliation Day for staff to sign out for their classes.

Mrs. Thompson and Eagle have been looking at many books to make sure they are in good shape. The book looked OK on the outside, but they found a mystery stain on the inside. 
Land of stories the Wishing Spell by Chris Colfer

What Matters by Alison Hughes




World CP Day







Our Empire Library - Book Reviews







Reconnecting With Wildlife - Welcoming Nature Back Into Our Lives






Our Welcome Banner

- 200 gr flour
- 50 gr sugar
- 1 Stick butter

 - When bubbling remove and put in to oven (375 degrees F)

Welcoming Countries Around the World

According to the article 'The Top 10 Most Welcoming Countries', countries have been ranked in order of how welcoming they are. We have focused on the top 4 most welcoming countries. They are: Portugal, Taiwan, Mexico, and Cambodia. Portugal is the most welcoming country because it is a sunny country, 29% of the local residents make up the majority of their friendship group. 40% of people who visited Portugal said they wanted to stay. Portuguese people are known to others as "looking after each other". Taiwan is the second most welcoming country and a great destination if you want to have friendly locals and to move easily. Visitors say that the Taiwanese people are very welcoming and 74% say it is easy to move to Taiwain. 86% of visitors say that the Taiwanese people have a friendly attitude towards foreign residents. Mexico comes in third as the most welcoming country. 88% of people surveyed say the general population is very friendly. 93% of people

surveyed said Mexicans were friendly people and 80% say it's easy to get used to the culture and 73% say it is easy to make local friends. The best thing about Mexico is the friendliness of the townspeople.
