Did you receive a letter from Region of Waterloo Public Health?

The annual enforcement of the Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA) helps to keep our students and schools healthy by stopping the spread of many diseases. Students need to have their vaccines up to date to attend school.

What parents need to do:

- ✓ Ensure your child's vaccinations are up to date.
- Ensure all vaccine records have been reported to Public Health or that you have a valid exemption on file.
- ✓ See your health care provider for vaccines that your child has missed.





Check your child's vaccination record to make sure they are fully vaccinated against these diseases:

Mandatory as of July 2014

- Tetanus
- Measles
- Meningitis

- Diphtheria
- Mumps
- Pertussis

Polio

- Rubella
- · Varicella*
- *Only for children born in 2010 and later.
- Book an appointment with your health care provider if needed or contact Public Health to update your child's record,
- Report each new vaccination to Public Health; your health care provider does not report these records for you.

Reminder:

- ✓ Students aged 4–6 require a booster dose for tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis and polio.
- ✓ Students require a booster dose for tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis 10 years after their 4–6 year dose.
