Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome back to school and Happy New Year! We hope all of our families had an exciting and wonderful holiday break! We are excited to be back at school and look forward to the rest of the school year!

December was a busy and exciting month here at Forest Glen! There were special days such as Red and Green Day; Hat, Mitts and Sock Day; Class Colour Day; Winter Wonderland Day and Pajama Day.

As we continue to experience the joys of Canadian winter weather, we want to remind families about a few important safety issues. In particular, we want to remind students to be extra careful when walking to and from school and staying off of roads, even when sidewalks may be difficult to navigate. Please take extra precautions when crossing streets to make sure that cars are actually stopped before crossing to ensure that the cars will not slip into intersections. Make sure to cross the street at the cross walk with the crossing guard. It is extremely important that students come to school prepared with appropriate clothing (hats, mittens/gloves, winter coat, snow pants, and boots) in order to be prepared to be outside throughout the day. Please do not request that students stay inside due to illness as we do not have the ability to supervise them. On days when we are faced with extreme cold or wind chill conditions, children will be kept inside as per Board Policy.

Please note that our **supervision** in the morning does not begin until **8:05 A.M**. We would ask that students do not arrive at school prior to this time as there is no yard supervision in place. As well, it is not permissible for students to be dropped at the main office prior to this time to be supervised. This is especially important during the winter weather as we do not want students to be standing outside in the cold for extended periods of time. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to our drop-off times.

Partial French Immersion

French language programs at the WRDSB begin in Gr. 1, where all students learn French through our Core French Program by listening, speaking, reading and writing. In Gr. 2, students can choose one of two pathways for French language learning. The two pathways are Core French or French Immersion. Students are automatically enrolled in Core French starting in Gr. 1 and will continue on the pathway of Core French, unless families register for French Immersion for Gr. 2. If your child completes French immersion from Grades 2 through 8, they can continue their French pathway in selected high schools.

Phase 1 of the Gr. 2 French immersion application process for students born in 2017 opens on January 10, 2024, and will close on January 31, 2024. Please direct any questions to: <u>frenchprograms@wrdsb.ca</u>

Kindergarten Registration- Sept. 2024

Any child who was born in 2019 or 2020 and lives in the 2024-25 <u>catchment area</u> of the school is eligible to attend Kindergarten. Information about Kindergarten and Before and After School Registration will be shared through various advertising streams beginning on January 15, 2024.

Announcements for registration for Kindergarten and the Before and After School Program will be made starting Jan. 15, 2024 at https://www.wrdsb.ca/kindergarten/.

Following online registration review, families will be invited to the school to meet with the office staff. These meetings are to validate the information contained in the online registration and include a review of original documents.

Note: Children who are currently attending Forest Glen in our Junior Kindergarten program do not need to register for the Kindergarten program.



Before and After School Programs 2023-24

Looking for child care? The WRDSB provides high quality before and after school programs for children in JK to Grade 6. Registration will open in the new year. A minimum number of pre-registrations are required to operate these programs. Schools will notify families in May if the program will not operate.

Program Highlights:

Available Monday - Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., conveniently located at your school.

Program operates during P.D. Days, March break, and winter break. All programs are subsidy eligible. Nutritional snacks are provided and there is Age-appropriate, highquality programming.
