At the end of the semester, a final Provincial Report Card will provide information regarding your child's development of Learning Skills and Work Habits, total number of absences and lates, and the final percentage grade.

reflects your child's most consistent level of achievement, and is determined on the basis of both mathematical calculations and teachers' professional judgement and interpretation of the evidence of learning. From the first report card to the final report card, this percentage grade may change, as your child continues to work toward providing evidence of essential learning for each course. Achievement below 50% will be shown differently depending on the grade of the course. For Grades 9 and 10, you may see an "I" or 45; for Grades 11 and 12, you may see an "I" or 45; for Grades 11 and 12, you may see an number between 35 and 45. These are the							_											_
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
