Stage 1: Selecting and researching an issue that is important to society

You are encouraged to use the Virtual Library Databases that provide academically-sound and reputable information. Go <u>to library.wrdsb.ca</u> to access the VL. Specifically, select Gale Online Resources.

Once in the Home page, select the **Global Issues in Context** database. Here, there are dozens of topics that have been generated; these include articles, videos and images plus their citations. You can share any materials found in this database with your Google Drive. Simply access the "Share" option on the page to send it to your account.


Stage 2: Apply two theories/theorists from the disciplines of Psych, Soc or Anthro to your issue
