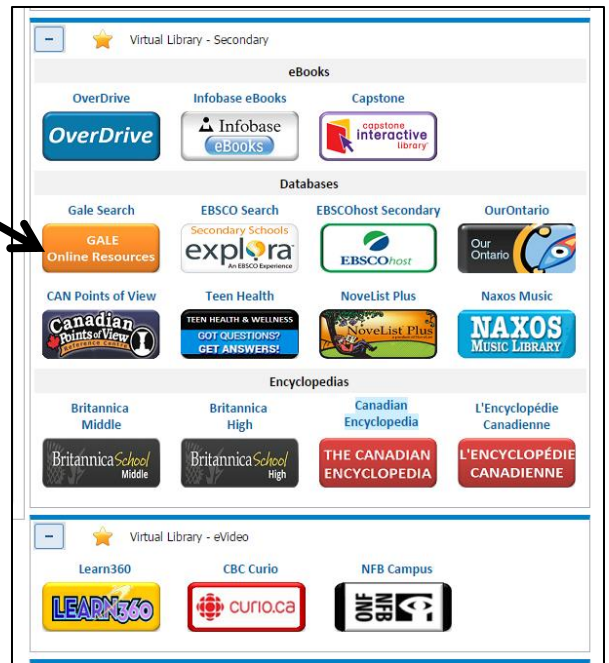


Stage 1: Selecting and researching an issue that is important to society

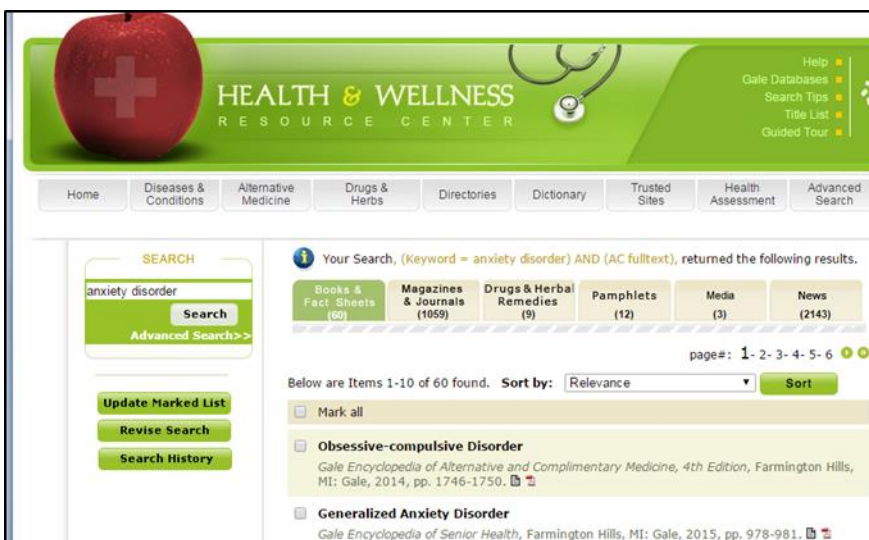
You are encouraged to use the Virtual Library Databases that provide academically-sound and reputable information. Go to library.wrdsb.ca to access the VL. Specifically, select Gale Online Resources.

Once in the Home page, select the **Global Issues in Context** database. Here, there are dozens of topics that have been generated; these include articles, videos and images plus their citations. You can send your materials to your Google Drive via the “Share” link.



Another good database is the **Health and Wellness Resource Center**. Its collection houses articles, fact sheets, journals, pamphlets, audio, and video files.

Within both of these databases you can make a folder to house the materials that you use.

Stage 3: Design an engaging Seminar

You have a 20 minute session in which to deliver your information in a manner that is both informative and engaging; your peers are to participate in some way. The Virtual Library has a section that focuses solely on video—including documentaries, CBC-produced programs and feature films.
