

Finding A Suitable Companion Piece For Your Novel









Your goal is to search for and select a source that shares a similar theme or concept that appears in your novel.




Let's start by finding a movie...

One can certainly think of movie titles based on plot or theme without too much difficulty. However, there is a good website that can assist you in narrowing down your choice:

<u>The</u> <u>International</u> <u>Movie Database</u>

On the homepage, use the ADVANCED SEARCH option to look for suitable films.





Another feature of imdb.com is that most films have trailers available for you to view. This means that you can preview the movie before you settle on one to watch fully.

For example, if I read All Quiet on the Western Front for my novel study, I could search for films related to "History" and "War" and could narrow down my search to "Trench Warfare" and "World War One". If you've selected a film for your companion piece, you need to view it! Perhaps it is a part of your home's cable package, or on Netflix. If you have a KPL card, you could borrow it from the library.

Or, it may be featured in the Virtual Library database called Learn 360.

<u>Go to the Library Learning Commons</u> <u>library.wrdsb.ca</u>

Accessing the Virtual Library from home is easy. Use Firefox or Chrome as the browser and go to library.wrdsb.ca. You will need to login. Use your school login and password here.



Now, scroll down the page and click on the Learn 360 icon.

Next, let's consider a SHORT STORY or a POEM for a companion piece.



Using my earlier example of All Quiet on the Western Front, I could consider looking for a short story or poem that contains themes such as: hope, survival, courage or loyalty.

This is where having a KPL card comes in extra handy:





Now, select "View Text" to see what this eBook describes. This online source provides excellent information such as character, plot, and other analyses.

When I typed "trench warfare" into the Tool bar in the Poetry For Students collection, I found the poem, "Blighters" by Siegfried Sassoon.

Lastly, let's consider a second novel as a companion piece.


Wait...you're telling me that I have to read ANOTHER book?????

Firstly, find your original novel using the Search Bar at the top of the site. Now, click on the tab, "More About This Book".
