

Everybody's Talking

Irreplaceable pearl: Archeologists digging in an ancient site in Western Australia hit the mother lode when they found a natural pearl that carbon dating showed was more than 2,000 years old. Found in a remote area in the Kimberley region, the pearl was analyzed for four years using non-invasive technology to confirm its age. Its round shape is extremely rare in nature. For this reason, scientific proof of its age was important to eliminate any chance that it was a modern creation. Associate professor Kat Szabo of the University of Wollongong said the pearl had all the classic signatures of a natural pearl.

Fake orca: Sea lions hanging around the docks along the coast in the city of Portland, Oregon, are starting to become a nuisance. Authorities have come up with a unique way to try to scare them away. They plan to put a fake orca in the water. It will putter around the area, spouting water and making orca-like sounds. This imitation has been named "Island" and is actually a boat made to look like an orca. It will tow a smaller orca behind it. Officials aren't sure the ploy is going to work. Sea lions are pretty smart and may figure out that the orcas aren't real.

Did You Know...

High peaks: The 5 highest mountains in the world, in order, are: Everest (Nepal/China); K2 (Pakistan/China); Kanchenjunga (India/Nepal); Lhotse I & Makalu I (Nepal/China)


