### Everybody's Talking

Gold-covered: Because its carved panels are edged with gold leaf, an historical cathedral in Porto, Portugal is known as the Gold Church. The building's real name is Igreja de Sao Fancisco (Church of Saint Francis). It was built in the 14<sup>th</sup> century and the gold leaf was added in the 1700s. Over the years the church has been occupied by troops during war, the gold has been stolen and once it was damaged by fire. **Seed stories:** The Royal Botanical Gardens in Burlington, ON has acquired a large library of seed catalogues dating back to the mid-1800s. These catalogues provided a plethora of information about different plants and crops in a time when there were many gardeners growing their own produce. Today, these catalogues provide historical information about types of plants that were grown.

**Up a tree:** People looking for a magical vacation need look no further than TreeHouse Point. Located about 20 miles from Seattle, Washington visitors can book one of several tree houses nestled in the branches of a lush forest of cedar and spruce. To top it off, guests can drift off to sleep while listening to the sound of the rushing water in a nearby river.

#### Did You Know...

**Noon heat:** Located north of Earth's equator at 23.5° north, the Tropic of Cancer is one of the 5 major degree measures that divide the Earth. In the northern hemisphere, it is the point at which the sun's rays are directly overhead at noon on the summer solstice, June 21.

**Power plant:** Opened in 1984, the Itaipu Dam is an enormous structure that supplies electricity for Brazil and Paraguay. Located on the border of these two countries on the Paraná River, the dam is almost five miles long.

**Apple seeds:** Almost everyone loves cashews! These nuts come from the cashew apple, which is the fruit of cashew trees. These trees are common in northeastern Brazil. The cashew nut is actually the seed of these apples.
