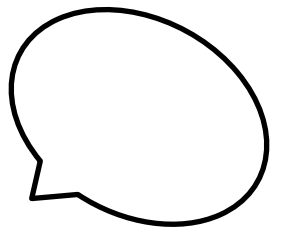

Did You Know...

Tree name: A common coniferous tree in North America is the Douglas fir. This tree was identified by Scottish botanist David Douglas, who was part of an expedition that explored the fauna in North America's Pacific northwest in the early 1820s.
