Everybody's Talking

Old mill: About 50 kms from Naples, Italy is an abandoned area called Valle dei Mulini, or Valley of the Mills. The valley is actually a gorge in which flour mills were set up centuries ago. In the mid-1800s, the gorge was cut off from the ocean when Sorrento's Tasso Square was built, making the spot too humid for use. Eventually, the buildings were abandoned; today they are covered with vines.

Humming sound: The soundscape of the small city of Windsor, ON includes something that has become known as the "Windsor Hum." Since the early 2010s, residents have been hearing the noise, and its cause is unclear. Sometimes the hum, which usually has a bass tone and can vibrate, goes on for hours, and other times it can carry on for days. Studies have been done to find the source, which is thought to be a steel plant, but there are still many mysteries surrounding the "Windsor Hum."

Did You Know...

Spiral-shaped galaxy: The Whirlpool Galaxy is 31 million light-years from Earth. Shaped like a spiral, it was discovered by French astronomer Charles Messier in 1773.

Moon talk: The Moon is 384, 400 kilometres from Earth. Apart from the Sun, it is the brightest object that we can see in the sky. It orbits Earth once per month.

Different eyes: People may be blue-eyed or brown-eyed, but not many people have one blue eve and one brown eye. This rare condition is called heterochromia iridis, and usually is not connected with any health problems.
