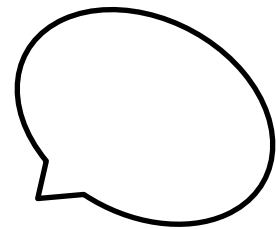

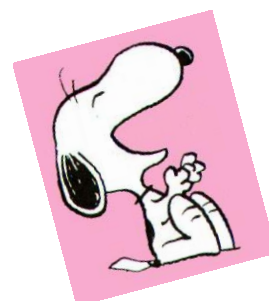
## On the Lighter Side
