- Language
- Mathematics
- Science and Technology
- Health and Physical Education
- The Arts

The Kindergarten report card includes parent friendly comments on the child's achievement in relation to overall expectations, the next steps for the teacher, as well as the next steps for the parents to assist them in supporting their child's learning.

CURRICULUM CORNER - For parents in the know!

Mathematics and the "Learning Cycle"

You may hear your child's teacher refer to a "learning cycle" this year and wonder what is that? John Darling teachers work both individually and collaboratively to plan "learning cycles" (units) that are based on Ontario Curriculum expectations in the various subject areas. As in all effective curriculum planning, we begin by exploring and evaluating just where each child is; specific to a very focused set of expectations. This is called *diagnostic assessment*, and it allows the teacher to tailor his/her delivery and resources to better suit the learning demands of each child. As we focus on refining our instructional strategies in mathematics, each grade group is participating in collaborative professional learning teams where they create a specific *learning goal* and identify success criteria for an engaging and relevant problem-solving task. In this process, the teacher uses student work as evidence to guide his/her planning. S/he identifies exactly what s/he wants the children to demonstrate (know and do) at the end of the math task(s) and at the end of the learning cycle. While working on the lesson, students explore familiar and new math strategies through solving problems. During the sharing/debrief portion of the lesson, students are supported as they build skills to effectively communicate their thinking and explain their solutions. Throughout the learning cycle, students have many opportunities to practise, practise, practise. As students are learning, teachers assess them formatively and regularly so that the feedback helps the learner access the concepts in a timely manner.

Through our WRDSB professional development experiences, we also benefit from the collective expertise in our schools. A group of our teachers continue to meet with other teacher teams from within our school board. With the support of our WRDSB consultants, Sandhills, Southridge and Grandview (New Hamburg), Sir Adam Beck and John Darling P.S. teachers are holding 4 inter-school learning sessions throughout the year.
