Students continue to demonstrate improved ability to communicate their thinking in mathematics. Staff and students share solutions to math problems using a variety of effective strategies and represent their thinking using pictures, numbers and/or words. Students are encouraged to work independently and collaboratively to use their understanding of number and mathematical concepts as they 'upack their thinking' and share their solutions to a variety of challenging math problems. By using a variety of assessment tools, such as the PM Benchmark reading assessment (Primary) and the CASI assessment (Junior), our teachers continue to monitor and assess our students' reading levels and comprehension abilities. This information assists teachers in focusing lessons towards appropriate learning goals, provide focused feedback to the learner and plan timely interventions to support the child on their learning journey. Our recent PD day in April was focused around Assessment and the Effective Use of Descriptive Feedback.

As a school community we continue to focus on our DRAKE behaviour code, and we talk about the values outlined in this code daily. We promote positive behaviours through leadership activities for the students and through learning experiences regarding conflict resolution and respect. We

show our respect for the environment by recycling, reducing our waste, conserving electricity and keeping our school and schoolyard clean and clear of litter.

We also continue to celebrate our students as they demonstrate 'good character' everyday through our Gotcha' Program.

We have a lot to be proud of and to celebrate at John Darling P.S. We look forward to sunny days and warmer weather as we race towards meeting academic, social and personal goals by the final school bell in June! Sincerely,

Class Planning Begins for 2013-2014

It is hard to believe that we will soon be making plans for the 2013-2014 school year! Teachers from each grade will be meeting to consider the placement of each child based on a combination of the following criteria:

- The academic level of the students
- Each child's learning skills
- The social/emotional levels of each student
- The relationship that exists between our students
- A balance, in each classroom, of students with special needs

This is a process that we take very seriously and it has a tremendous impact on the whole school year. We do our best to ensure that your child's placement will best serve his/her learning needs.

There will be a number of combined (split) classes at John Darling next year. A misconception of split grades is that combined classes are more distracting than same grade classes, with the image that the teacher is rushing back and forth between the grades teaching different lessons. In reality, there are

children working at a wide range of levels in any class at any point in time. Our instruction is delivered in such a way that children can respond and work at their level while the teacher programs to move them along the learning continuum. One strategy is to differentiate teaching and learning tasks to meet the needs of the individual learner. Another is to utilize small group instruction in the classroom to hone in on particular concepts and skills with specific learners.

As part of this planning, parents may choose to submit, *in writing*, characteristics of the child(ren) and any observations that they would like the school to keep in mind about their child(ren) when developing classes. If you wish us to consider specific information about your child's placement for September, we ask that you submit this in writing to Ms. McKenzie by Friday, May 31, 2013. Please understand that this is not an opportunity to request a specific teacher for your child(ren). Since our staffing, organization and procedures for September are not completed at this time, we cannot guarantee placement of your child(ren) with a specific staff member. We ask that all families recognize that as a staff, we take class organizations very seriously and give it careful thought, reflection and planning based on the best interests and needs of all students.

EQAO DATES

Grade 3/6 EQAO assessment dates have been established for the spring of 2013. We ask that parents of Grade 3 and Grade 6 students at John Darling make every effort to avoid scheduling appointments, trips, or other activities during this time. Our students will write the EQAO assessments during the following dates: Between May 27th – June 7th.

If you are moving between now and the start of school in September, please let the office know. Trying to accurately predict our enrolment for next September is critical and allows


Mrs. Heuchert delivered a healthy baby girl at 11:10pm on Thursday, April 25th, 2013. Her name is *Jane*.

A Friendly Summer Reminder

DRESS CODE GUIDELINES

Student dress must complement the learning environment and must not offend or distract others. In accordance with the Waterloo Region District School Board, Administrative Procedures, guidelines have been established to encourage responsibility, self-esteem, a sense of school pride and to foster the positive learning environment at John Darling Public School. These include the following principles:

Cleanliness Neatness Good Taste Safety

We request your cooperation by discussing the following requirements with your children and by encouraging them to adopt a positive, responsible approach to their school attire:

- wide-strap tank tops only
- tops should cover upper body from waist to shoulders and be made of solid fabric
- writing and graphics on clothing must be appropriate
- hats may not be worn in classrooms
- no gang-related clothing will be worn on school property
- shorts and skirts will be a respectable length
- hats are taken off at the entrances to the school

Students in contravention of the dress code will be asked to change or, if appropriate clothing is not readily available, be asked to go home to change.

Where a misunderstanding arises, the administration will decide on the appropriate course of action to ensure fairness and respect for all students.
