A Friendly Summer Reminder

DRESS CODE GUIDELINES



Student dress must complement the learning environment and must not offend or distract others. In accordance with the Waterloo Region District School Board, Administrative Procedures, guidelines have been established to encourage responsibility, self-esteem, a sense of school pride and to foster the positive learning environment at John Darling Public School. These include the following principles:

Cleanliness **Neatness Good Taste** Safety

We request your cooperation by discussing the following requirements with your children and by encouraging them to adopt a positive, responsible approach to their school attire:

- wide-strap tank tops only
- tops should cover upper body from waist to shoulders and be made of solid fabric
- writing and graphics on clothing must be appropriate
- hats may not be worn in classrooms
- no gang-related clothing will be worn on school property
- shorts and skirts will be a respectable • length
- hats are taken off at the entrances to the school

Students in contravention of the dress code will be asked to change or, if appropriate clothing is not readily available, be asked to go home to change. Where a misunderstanding arises, the administration will decide on the appropriate course of action to ensure fairness and respect for all students.
