### **1. Getting Started**

### **2. Election of Co-Chair**

Michelle Martin has come forward to act as co-chair on council. Jackie moved to elect her and Beth seconded it.

### **3. Committee Updates**

**Christmas Giving:** Is called “The Christmas Tree”. Only one family has asked for support thus far. Adopt a Family has already taken care of the other families we had in need. Donations have been requested emphasizing gift certificates/cards for food. The next letter will specify what is still needed. Gifts will be distributed on December 17<sup>th</sup>. The school also has a Christmas backpack program that collects items to be donated in the community. Gillian suggested that if we have excess gifts, we can consider giving them to this program.

**Health and Wellness Night:** February 7<sup>th</sup> 6:00-8:00pm. Different rooms will be set up featuring snack/meal ideas, allergy and food sensitivity info, mental wellness and Bubble therapy, yoga video, colouring time and music. Louise Friesen will be contacted to include the fitness piece that she would like to offer. Discussion ensued around whether we want to pay for the Drum Fit. Michelle reported that there is a possible discount of \$100 which she will pursue. We do have a grant of \$1000 to put toward this. We will advertise the date before Christmas so people can save the date on their calendars.

**Fundraising:** Treasures Books made \$2070.00 profit. Dielman’s made 6,765.17 profit (\$4,280.90 from catalogue; \$220 from magazine; \$220 from internet sales). The chocolate sold really well.

Recommendations: When families have enquiries, please direct them to the chair people directly. Also, people should check that their items are intact and in good condition upon receipt in case anything needs to be exchanged.

**WRAPSC** – See attachment. Helen reported that the Board is now permitted to have movie nights and charge admission. There was some discussion as to whether we will have a movie

**Principal’s Report** - attached

It was noted that parents are welcome to attend school assemblies as long as any other children that are brought along are well-behaved.

Kindergarten outdoor play times will be separated from the rest of the school to allow more focus on safety, improve the flow of their day and to enhance their play-based learning instruction.

Our school is considering using “School Day” program, an on-line system to give parents access to pay for school trips, manage consent forms, organize parent-teacher interviews, etc. Gillian is also striving to eliminate the paper newsletter by then end of the year unless requested by individual families.

The proposed “Personal Devices Responsible Use Policy” was presented. Concerns were raised by council members as to whether this will create an unfair balance within classrooms between those who have these devices to bring in and those who don’t. Concerns were also raised that children will feel pressured to either have their families purchase more devices and also to pressure their parents to let them bring them into school. Gillian suggested that council dialogues with other parents about this and we can discuss it again at a later date.

### **WRAPSC UPDATE NOVEMBER 4<sup>TH</sup> 2013.**

- Helen’s not sure if this has been told to the council yet but The board has a permit/license now that allows schools to have movie nights and charge admission for fundraising.
- Boards financial situation – there is a projected deficit of \$4.6 million in the year 2013/2014 – due to decrease in enrollment and changes in Provincial funding
- Talk of 25 areas to reduce their deficit, they’ve already saved \$100,000 in courier services. They tried not to keep the 25 areas in view for very long, in order to keep with the meetings timeline!
- Still researching the areas and lots of pending decisions – this is all still new to everyone working within this area.
- Helen’s view – wondering why and how the board can afford new renovations at the board office with many expensive updates including 90” TV’s in meeting rooms etc.
- Bell time presentation – The board spends \$1 million more than they receive (spends \$15.6M on student transportation and only receives \$14.6M).
- The online surveys went out on October 28<sup>th</sup>, deadline is November 14<sup>th</sup>, 2,687 responses so far.
- It costs the board \$37,000 per bus per year. That’s \$111,000 for 3 buses per year.
- An example was given that if you had schools A,B and C with separate buses. If school A’s bell times were 10 minutes earlier. School B’s was 10 minutes later and school C’s was 20 minutes later, you would only need 1 bus for those 3 schools it would be a savings of \$56, 700.
- Points that were made – The Catholic school board would HAVE to be on board for this to work. Before and After school care costs will increase and decrease depending on the new bell times.
- 92 schools will change by 10 minutes or less, 45 schools wont be affected.
- There was a talk of a new 34 credit threshold in high schools.

- There is reduced funding from the government for students who have reached 34 credits in high school and wish to return for extra credits. Students with IEP's, ESL and other needs are exempt.
- There's an estimated loss of \$1/2 million due to returning students after 34 credits. The board is now advising grade 9 students of this new policy.
- EQAO reps came in to talk about the EQAO results, mostly what Gillian covered at our last meetings.
