"Feedback is not advice, praise, or evaluation. Feedback is information about how we are doing in our efforts to reach a goal." (Grant Wiggins)

"Effective feedback shows students how to look at their work using criteria from the assignment." (Moss and Brookhart, 2009) "When students have clear, accurate, timely and descriptive information, they are in the driver's seat for improving their learning. They will work harder because they are clear about what the target looks like and what they need to do to achieve it. They will persevere because they will be proving their own capability." (O'Neill and Conzemius, 2006)

In our goal setting, we have high expectations for our students. As the educational researcher John Hattie suggests, our goal is for our students to see that through hard work and perseverance, they can achieve their goals, and more!

#### KINDERGARTEN REPORTING

The provincial report card is designed to give parents clear, detailed information about the expectations for the end of Kindergarten. It reflects achievement in the skills and strategies that the child is developing as they progress through the 2 year program. The report reflects evaluation of achievement in all six areas of learning:

- Personal and Social Development
- Language
- Mathematics
- Science and Technology
- Health and Physical Education

The Kindergarten report card includes parent friendly comments on the child's achievement in relation to overall expectations, the next steps for the teacher, as well as the next steps for the parents to assist them in supporting their child's learning.

#### **Core French Reporting**

The revised French as a Second Language curriculum (2013) has **four** strands in French: Listening, Speaking, Reading, Writing. This is a change from the previous curriculum which only had three strands (Oral Communication, Reading, Writing). For students in Grade 1 Core French, in Term 1 only, teachers will report on the Listening and Speaking strands only. Grades 2-6 will report on all 4 strands on both the February and June report cards.


