

ARMY RESERVE CO-OP EDUCATION PROGRAM



Motivated students should identify themselves to their respective Co-op Teachers and ensure that they are properly enrolled in the Co-op Program in accordance with school district policy. In most cases a Consent Form is required that is initiated at the school. A Canadian Forces Employment Application Form along with the following original documents are required to be submitted for processing at the Army Reserve Recruiting Office Cambridge:

The Co-op program runs Tues-Fri from 12:30 to 5:30 PM, with additional work available on Thursday nights. Infantry and Artillery Co-op run throughout first semester, and Combat Engineer begins second semester.

Canadian Forces Aptitude test

You are given 45 minutes to answer all of the questions: you will be given 4 answers for each question, but only one is correct. The test has 60 questions, broken down into three parts:

- Verbal skills (15 questions, 5 minute limit to finish)
- Spatial ability (15 questions, 10 minute limit to finish)
- Problem solving (30 questions, 30 minute limit to finish)

Have a look at the Canadian Armed Forces practice test which gives you an understanding of the *type* of questions you are expected to encounter. Please note that the actual Aptitude test questions are considerably more difficult than the Practice test.
