7:00-7:05 Welcome, Jennifer McKinnon

The Keatsway School Council meets monthly during the school year. A major role of School Council is to create a level environment for all students in terms of opportunities, field trips and activities available. The meetings provide the opportunity to share information and provide parent input to school, School Board and Ministry of Education programs and plans. The mandate of the Council is to provide parents/guardians with the means to advise the principal and the board on ideas, which lead to improving learning opportunities for students. Keatsway School Council also provides support for the students through fundraising activities. All Keatsway parents are welcome and encouraged to attend the monthly meetings. Community members, including parents of children who will be attending Keatsway in the future, are also welcome at all meetings.

7:05-7:40 Principal's Report, Lori Briscoe

Principal Lori Briscoe reported on the various activities in the classrooms, from the Kindergarten students settling in and learning routines, to the Grade 6 Camp.

On Monday, September 26, an information night was held at the school to discuss the new Ontario Health Curriculum. It was an opportunity for parents to learn specifically about how Keatsway will be addressing the various expectations within each grade level. Ms. Mezo, health teacher, led the evening's discussion, together with Lori Briscoe and Brian Weigel. There were 3 language interpreters (requests had been made available on the form that went home with students), and twenty parents came for the talk. Ms. Mezo presented the Health Curriculum information, clarified any fears or misconceptions, and answered questions. In the end, all parents left well informed, and did not request any special accommodations.

Lori presented information on Ontario Physical Education (OPHEA) guidelines, updated for September 2016. All teachers are required to follow these guidelines, be it for Physical Education (gym) or Daily Physical Activity (DPA). For example, there are new guidelines that address jewellery when participating in either gym or DPA. Teachers may choose from different activities, based on grade level, but as students reach higher grade levels, there are more activities that are subject to these guidelines. For example, some activities require no exposed jewellery, some no hanging jewellery, and some no jewellery at all. More information can be found here: http://safety.ophea.net/

Lori presented on new initiatives at Keatsway addressing mindfulness and meditation. At the first assembly of the year, the theme was Mindful Eating. A video of a reading of the book *No Ordinary Apple* was shown. Students have been asked to take the first ten minutes of their twenty-minute eating portion of Nutrition Break to remain quiet, practise mindful eating, and focus on their food. It is not a rule or

compliance task, but rather a way to encourage mindful eating, which might include thinking about being grateful (to parents, to farmers, etc), or how eating fuels and nourishes. Later that week, students also participated in mindfulness activities with guest Steph Van De Ven. Such activities have been shown to help children with things such as focus, self-regulation, and anxiety.

The dress code at Keatsway has been updated to provide more general terminology. It can be seen in the students' planners. School Council can review this dress code and revisit at future meetings, if desired.

Current enrolment is at 383, and there are five new staff members.
