School Day is intended to help parents sign up for extra-curricular events, approve permission forms; sign up for parent/teacher interviews; minimize the risks associated with sending money to school with their child ("backpack delivery"); and reduce the environmental impact of photocopying permission forms and announcements. Rania Al-Hammoud came up with a project for her first year U of W engineering students to design a playground for Keatsway. The university students met with Keatsway students to brainstorm on playground ideas. Apart from their own class requirements, all designs had to meet

specifications with regard to CSA compliance, budget constraints, etc. Members of School Council, Lori Briscoe, and Rob Seeley, WRDSB Facility Services, viewed 35 student presentations at the university, and chose the top 10. These 10 groups presented to Keatsway students and teachers at an assembly on April 4. The kids had a blast, and articles were posted on the record and CBC websites. Students cast their votes for the top 3 designs. These designs will be on display at the Fun Fair on June 15, when students can vote to choose one design. Keatsway is under no obligation to use this design, however the design process represents a significant portion of a playground budget, and we can adapt to suit restrictions and specifications.
