Financial reports from the board are finally available, so we now have final numbers for our fall fundraising efforts:

• Pizza sales started at the end of October and are doing well; we have already made \$1351.90 this year, with weekly profits usually over \$100

The fall fundraiser, pizza day, and cookie day fundraisers are all going toward general council spending. Even at current values, they should cover our annual expenses, so it is possible that future pizza earnings can be diverted to the playground. All other fundraisers are going toward the playground. In particular, the "Gift of Play" fundraiser for the playground has been very successful. Unfortunately, many donations were made directly to WEFI, and the school board is not yet providing us reports on WEFI accounts, so a final amount is not yet known. The current estimate is that we raised about \$10,000. Taking into account money that school council has raised and the promised matching donation from our anonymous donor, the playground fund is almost at \$60,000.
