Class Placement 2015-2016

It is hard to believe that the 2015/2016 school year is just around the corner! The office will be sitting down to make up classes, based upon our best estimate of the enrollment projections for the coming year. At this point we will begin the next school year with the same number of students as this year. Our Kindergarten numbers are up, but our numbers in grades 1-6 are down, meaning that we will organize with 8 classes instead of 9.

When classes are assembled, the focus is to make them heterogeneous. The major factors we consider are:

- The academic level of each student, creating a balance of needs in each class
- The learning skills of each student
- The social/emotional levels of each student
- The relationships among students
- How the child's leadership potential will have an opportunity to develop in the class
- A balance of girls and boys

While attempts are made to place children with at least one or two of his/her current friends, we find that children are adaptable and will make friends wherever they are placed. The guiding principle is to group children for instructional purposes. We do our best to ensure that your child's placement will best serve his/her learning needs.

As part of this planning, parents may choose to submit, in writing, characteristics of their child(ren) and any observations that they would like the school to keep in mind when developing the classes. Sometimes parents offer information about friendships and learning styles, which help us with social groupings.

If you wish for the office to consider specific information about your child's placement for September, we ask that you submit this in writing to Mrs. Bileski by Monday, June 1st. This information will be taken into account; however, in organizing for the learning needs of all the students in the school we cannot promise that individual requests will be granted. Also, please understand that this is not an opportunity to request a specific teacher for your child. Since the organizational process occurs in June, with staff possibly choosing to transfer, we cannot guarantee that specific teachers will be here in September or that they will be teaching the same grade level as this year.

This is a process that is taken very seriously. We do our best to ensure that your child's placement will best serve his/her learning needs. Considering that we are a small school, please remember that our choices of placement are quite limited and will most likely involve blended classes.

If you are aware of neighbours with children moving into our area, please send them to register ASAP.

Update on Administration of EQAO Grade 3 and 6 Assessment

The Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) notified the WRDSB that it will not be sending the Grade 3 and 6 Reading, Writing and Mathematics assessment materials to any boards currently affected by labour action.

As a result, no WRDSB students in Grades 3 and 6 will participate in the EQAO assessment this year, until further notice.

Should the labour situation change prior to the planned administration, EQAO has assured Boards of Education that they will update us immediately with any proposed changes to this plan.
