We are a Nut Free School

The safety of all our students is paramount to all staff at Lexington. Lexington made the important decision to become a nut-free school. We currently have six out of ten classrooms that have students with severe allergies.

It is the policy of the Waterloo Region District School Board, as required by Statutes of Ontario 2005, Chapter 7 (Sabrina's Law), to ensure the implementation of:

- strategies that reduce the risk of exposure to anaphylactic causative agents in classrooms and common school areas;
- a communication plan for the dissemination of information on life-threatening allergies to parents, pupils and employees;
- regular training on dealing with life-threatening allergies for all employees and others who are in direct contact with pupils on a regular basis.

Anaphylaxis Canada states that approximately 2.5 million Canadians are affected by food allergies! We hope to greatly reduce the risk by asking families to not send products that contain or may contain nuts. We appreciate the effort in creating the safest environment for our students.
