

November1	All Saints Day	Christianity	This day is for honouring Christian Saints, known and unknown, throughout the ages.		
November 1-5	Holocaust Education Week	-	Marked annually in the first week of November is an opportunity to engage in learning about the devastating history of Holocaust, antiSemitism and how they impact the Jewish Community in contemporary society.

Treaties Recognition Week 2021	First Nations, Métis, Inuit, and non-Indigenous Peoples living in Ontario	A week to bring awareness to the treaty relationships between Indigenous and non-Indigenous people in the province of Ontario. Resources related to Treaty Recognition Week and treaties are available on the <u>WRDSB</u> <u>Indigenous Education</u> website for staff.
TransParent Day		First Sunday in November- This day was first established in 2009 and is a day to celebrate and honour transgender parents instead of the traditional Mother's or Father's Day. Today the day also includes parents who have transgender children. This day typically involves small celebrations and gift-giving to one's parent or caregiver.
International Inuit Day	Indigenous Peoples of Canada	On Inuit Day we recognize the cultures, histories, contemporary contexts and rich contributions of Inuit peoples in our city and across the country.
National Indigenous Veterans Day	First Nations, Métis, Inuit, and non-Indigenous Peoples living in Canada	November 8th is National Indigenous Veterans' Day, a day of remembrance and commemoration of the contributions of Indigenous veterans in the First and Second World Wars, as well as the Korean War.

Remembrance Day	National	A day to remember those who lost their lives in the line of duty.
Transgender Awareness Week		Dedicated to increasing visibility and awareness of the transgender community.
International Transgender Day of Remembrance		This day represents awareness of the threat of violence faced by those who identify or are perceived to be under the trans/gender variant umbrella and the persistence of prejudice felt by the transgender community.
National Child Day	Federal	Canada has declared November 20th as National Child Day to celebrate the rights of children. November 20th was chosen as the day to celebrate National Child Day because the United Nations adopted the <u>United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child</u> (UNCRC) on November 20, 1989.
Canada History Week	Federal	Canada History Week provides all Canadians with opportunities to learn more about the people and events that have shaped the country that we know today.
Bullying Prevention and Awareness Week	Provincial	During Bullying Awareness and Prevention Week Ontario students, school staff and parents/guardians are encouraged to learn more about bullying and its effect on student learning and well-being.
Martyrdom of Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji*	Sikhism	Commemorates the martyrdom of Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, the ninth of the Ten Sikh Gurus. He is remembered not only for his defense of the Sikh Faith, but also for willingly giving up his life for religious liberty of all faiths.
International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women	United Nations	Women's activists have marked 25 November as a day against violence since 1981. This date came from the brutal assassination in 1960, of the three Mirabal sisters, political activists in the Dominican Republic.
Holodomor Memorial Day	Federal	On the fourth Saturday in November, we join Ukrainian communities around the world in remembering the victims of Holodomor and honouring the strength of survivors. "Between 1932 and 1933, Joseph Stalin's totalitarian Soviet regime inflicted mass starvation and genocide on the people of Ukraine. Known to history as the Holodomor, or 'killing by starvation', between three million and four million Ukrainian children, women and men died. Lands were stolen and crops grown by the people were seized. "The Soviet Union's systematic and mass starvation of the Ukrainian people was a heinous attempt to quell the nation's culture and dream of independence. Almost 60 years later, that dream of independence was realized.

November 27 - December 24	Advent	The 4 <sup>th</sup> Sunday before Christmas, this is the beginning of the Church year and the start of a period of spiritual preparation for the coming of the Lord, Jesus Christ.
November 28- January 6, 2023	Christmas/Nativity Fast begins	The 40 day period before Christmas (Dec 25 <sup>th</sup> New Calendar for January 7 Old Calendar), is a time of spiritual preparation for the coming of the Lord, Jesus Christ.
November 30	Birthdate of Guru Nanak Devi Ji	 Commemorates the birth of the founder of the Sikh faith, an accomplished poet and the first of the Ten Gurus in 1469 CE. Also called Guru Nanak Dev Ji Gurpurab.
