## Parent Involvement Grant

- Costs incurred for workshops supporting student learning and achievement;
- Costs related to the development and maintenance of the school websites;
- Initiatives that assist special community populations facing access/involvement barriers.


## Our Ideas for the Money

- Primary grades have a literacy focus
- Juniors have a math focus
- Possibly combining this with another grant for $\$ 500$ to give us $\$ 1000$
- Decodable books as an option to help with the new reading approach, phonemic awareness and phonics program, helps them write and teaches them how to spell


## Voting Results

A vote took place online ahead of the meeting in an effort to save time and facilitate discussion. Two questions were asked with the results from the 12 voters as follows:

1. Should we give the school another $\$ 3000$ ?
a. YES WE SHOULD- 16.67\%
b. NO WE SHOULDN'T- 33.3\%
c. WE WILL GIVE \$1000 TO COVER THE COST OF ONE PROJECTOR 41.67\%
d. OTHER- 8.33\%
*Julie purchased 2 projectors already, thanked council for their input, but she needs to prioritize the school's budget needs over council's vote in this case and said she gets the final decision
2. Where should our fundraising money go?
a. PLAY STRUCTURE 33.3\%
b. FULFILL TEACHER WISHLIST ON AN ONGOING BASIS- 0\%
c. COMBINATION OF THE TWO 50\%
d. OTHER-16.67\%

## Additional Notes

*Julie hasn't received a response on the end life of the existing play structure. We had a discussion about how realistic funding a play structure is for the school, and how it may make more sense to spend money on enhancing the field and play areas at the school. Items like GaGa ball pits or similar items to give kids other options to play during recess. Soccer has been the main game which has been causing conflict on a daily basis
