Ontario Secondary School Diploma

- 30 credits are required to earn your OSSD (Ontario Secondary School Diploma)
 - 18 compulsory credits
 - 12 optional credits
- Community Involvement 40 hours
- Literacy Requirements Ontario Literacy Test (written in grade 10)
- Note: the "34 credit threshold" takes effect Sept.
 2013, but does not apply to ESL students or students with an IEP

Ontario Secondary School Diploma

- 18 Compulsory Credits:
 - 4 English (1 per grade)
 - 1 French
 - 3 Math (at least one in gr.11 or 12)
 - 2 Science (gr. 9 & 10)
 - 1 Canadian Geography (gr. 9)
 - 1 Canadian History (gr. 10)
 - 1 Arts
 - 1 Health and Physical Education
 - 0.5 Career Studies / 0.5 Civics (gr. 10)

- 12 Optional Credits choose from courses such as ...

 - Intro. to Anthropology, Psychology & Sociology (gr. 11)

 - Medical Technologies (gr. 12)
 - Computer Engineering (gr. 10, 11, 12)



Course Types

GRADES 9 & 10

Academic

emphasize theory and abstract problems.

Applied

 focus on practical applications and concrete examples.

Open

- prepare you for further study in certain subjects and enrich your education generally.
- Note: You may change course type when you move from a Grade 9 course to a Grade 10 course. For example, if you complete Grade 9 applied science, you may take Grade 10 academic science.

GRADES 11 & 12

University

 to meet the entrance requirements for university programs.

University/College

 to meet the entrance requirements for specific programs offered at universities and colleges.

College

 to meet the entrance requirements for most college programs or apprenticeship and other training programs.

Workplace

 to meet the expectations of employers or the requirements for admission to certain apprenticeship and other training programs.

Open

 Open courses may not be designed for specific requirements of universities, colleges, or the workplace.

Post-Secondary Destinations

- University
- College
- Apprenticeship and Skilled Trades
- On-the-Job Training and Work



Decisions to be Made for Grade 9

Compulsory Course Level Decisions

- English, Math, and Science
 - Academic or Applied
- Geography, French
 - Academic or Applied



Academic Courses



- Offered in core areas:
 - Math, English, Science, French, Geography
- Cover essential concepts plus additional material
- Greater emphasis on THEORY as a basis for future learning and problem solving
- Focus on ABSTRACT applications of essential concepts
- Prepare students for university and college level courses in grades 11 and 12
- Guideline: Careful consideration of the student's ability



Applied Courses



- Offered in core areas:
 - Math, English, Science, French, Geography
- Focus on the essential concepts
- Emphasize PRACTICAL and CONCRETE applications
- Relate to familiar real-life situations and provides students with the opportunity for HANDS-ON APPLICATION of the concepts they learn
- Prepare students for college, apprenticeship and skilled trades, and workplace courses in grades 11 and 12

Guideline: Careful consideration of the student's ability



Open Courses

- Have a set of expectations that is suitable for all students at a given grade level
- Provides students with a broad educational base
 - e.g. Arts, Phys. Ed., Family Studies, Technological Education, Cooperative Education

- All course selections will be done via an online portal (Feb. 26th to March 6th, 2015)
- Login to 'My Way' at home, review teacher recommendations, discuss course selection with child, then input information at school with assistance from MacGregor and high school guidance staff (March 4th)



MyWay Instructions



Step 6: Under the menu bar click on "Printer friendly version"

Step 7: Print off your **Course Request** sheet and **return** a signed copy to your teacher

Step 8: Logout (right side of menu bar)

Choose your courses from the **drop-down** menu.

Click Add Course

The course text will turn colour as you choose the recommended courses.

Green: You have chosen the course type (academic, applied, essential) recommended for you.

Yellow: You have chosen a different course type then your teacher recommended.

Red: Contact your teacher for help.



Frequently Asked Questions

- Will there be an opportunity to switch courses (e.g. applied → academic) during the grade 9 year?
 - Not likely, due to timetable constraints.
- Is it possible to change course types from Grade 9 to Grade 10?
 - Yes. This is easier for courses such as English or Geography, but more difficult for Math.

Frequently Asked Questions

- What happens when a student / parent chooses a different course type than that recommended by teachers / guidance?
 - Final decisions rest with the students/parents.
- Does the student have to take all the same type of course?
 - No, students can select different course types depending on their strengths (i.e. academic math, applied English)

Frequently Asked Questions

- Can my child attend a school other than their home school?
 - Only if they are applying for and are accepted into a specialized program (i.e. Arts, IB, Fast Forward).
 "Principal-to-Principal Transfer Requests" may be approved if there are exceptional personal circumstances to support the transfer request, which is in turn supported by documentation from an appropriate source (i.e. doctor, professional counsellor, etc.)
