| - 1 | Allium (purple) | Millenium: mini ornamental onion; striking cut flower. |
| 2 | Ajuga: Bugleweed | Maroon ground cover for shady areas. Purple flowers. |
| 3 | Ajuga: Burgundy Glow | Tricolor foliage. Low creeping ground cover. |
| 4 | Armeria (pink) | Maritima: unique grassy foliage; 6 " flowers all summer. |
| 5 | BeeBaim (red) | Monarda: native, fragrant, sun plant for bees/butterfies |
| 6 | Bergenia Cordifolia (pink) | Pigsqueak: easily grown in shade or sun. |
| 7 | Black Eyed Susans | Goldstrum: lots of flowers late summer into fall. |
| 8 | Coneflower: Purple | Attract bees/butterflies. Flowers summer into fall. |
| 9 | Coneflower: White | Adds beauty and vitality to any garden; sun/haff shade. |
| 10 | Creeping Jenny | Lime green ground cover. Great for hanging pots. |
| 11 | Daylily: Stella D'Oro (yellow) | Blooms all summer long on dwarf compact plant. |
| 12 | Daylily: Happy Returns | Bright lemon yellow is a real eye catcher. Compact |
| 13 | Daylily: Kitten's Paw | Summertime peachy splash in your garden. |
| 14 | Daylily: Red Spider | Compact; long summertime bloomer with orange splash. |
| 15 | Evening Primrose (yellow) | Produces cup shaped blossoms summer evenings. |
| 16 | Grasses: Blue Fescue | Adds blue color to your garden right through winter |
| 17 | Grasses: Karl Foerster | Tall, $5-6 \mathrm{ft}$, stands straight all winter.\#1 seller. |
| 18 | Grasses: El Dorado | 4 ft . with gold stripe centre and tan plume |
| 19 | Grasses: Ribbon | A spreading variegated $4 \mathrm{ft} \mathrm{grass;} \mathrm{indestructible}$. |
| 20 | Hens and Chicks (mix) | Great for rock gardens or almost anywhere |
| 21 | Heuchera: Coral Bells | Compact mound with red flowers; good for shade a |
| 22 | Heuchera: Melting Fire | Deep maroon foliage wis |
| 23 | Heuchera: Purple Palace | Maroon maple shaded leaves; gre |
| 24 | Hosta (solid green) | Great shade plant to start a garden. |
| 25 | Husker Red (soft pink) | Beard-Tongue: beet like mound of leaves; outstand |
| 26 | Iris (white dwarf) | Large spring flowers on a short stem. Full sun. |
| 27 | Lady's Mantle | Thriller: Pleated foliage hods water; good |
| 28 | Phlox: Creeping blue | Deltoides; loaded with white flowers with bright red eyes |
| 29 | Pinks: Arctic Fire | Deltoides; loaded with white flowers; indestructible. |
| 30 | Sedum: Autumn Joy (red) |  |
| 31 | Sedum: Blue Spruce | short stems with large heads of flowers; like Autumn Joy |
| 32 | Sedum: Crystal Pink | Fast growing, sturdy plants for ground cover. |
| 33 | Sedum: Dragon's Blood (red) | Fow mat forming, sturdy plants groundcover for full hot sun spots |
| 34 | Sedum: John Creech (pink) | Low mat forming groundcover for full hot sun spots |
| 35 | Sedum: Kamtschaticum | Great for hot/dry areas; rabbit and deer resistant. |
| 36 | Sedum: Lime Zinger (pink) | Excellent groundcover for hot, dry, poor soil sites. |
| 37 | Sedum: Tricolor Spurium | Alaska: 2-3 ft; large single flowers; attracts butterflies. |
| 38 | Shasta Daisy (white) | Alaska: 2-3 ti; large single flowers; atracts |
| 39 | Siberian Iris (purple) | Easy, full sun, graceful plants with slim, grassy folage |
| 40 | Veronica Spicata (blue) | Blue Bouquet: late summer time spiked fowers. |
