Mary Johnston Public School School Council Minutes October 21, 2015

- **1. Request for funds:** Mme Hutton and Mlle McManus, 2/3 French Immersion teachers, presented their classes' request for \$200. The idea, inspired by WE Day, is to build benches where students can sit during recess as a way to indicate that they would like to be invited to play. The students would like to build 2 benches at a cost of \$100/bench.
- **2. Parking update:** Constable Bray from the City of Waterloo Bylaw Enforcement office provided an update regarding parking enforcement efforts at Mary Johnston. Parents and staff continue to communicate concerns regarding drivers who ignore safety laws, putting students at risk. Mary Johnston is one of 5 "problem schools" and will receive high priority for visits from the City's single enforcement officer.

As of October 21, the enforcement officer had visited Mary Johnston 15 times in October, an unprecedented number of visits, resulting in over 15 documented violations. Parents and staff have observed that compliance improves when the officer is present, but that people continue to disobey posted signs when the officer is gone.

Parents may provide the license plate numbers of offenders to the principal, Mr. Tinnes, who will forward them to the proper authorities.

Under the Highway Traffic Act, the Definition of Park or Parking, when prohibited, means the standing of a vehicle whether occupied or not, except when standing temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers.

The definition of Stop or Stopping, when prohibited, means the halting of a vehicle, even momentarily, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or a traffic control sign or signal.

The definition of Stand or Standing, when prohibited, means the halting of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except for the purpose of and while actually engaged in receiving or discharging passengers.

3. Principal's Update: The school community raised \$1500 for the Terry Fox Run which took place in October. Although the magazine fundraiser is postponed due to the teachers' job action, parents may renew or purchase new subscriptions at any time and it will count towards the fundraising initiative. October 30 is a planned spirit day with details sent via School Day. The Caribou Math Contest for students in Grades 3 - 6 is underway with forty students participating from Mary Johnston. Mary Johnston had students place 40th and 41st. Job sanctions are still in place but students have not been affected.

- **4. Treasurer:** Heather Andrews was acclaimed as the new Treasurer for this year's school council. Heather will prepare a budget to present at the next School Council meeting.
- **5.** Waterloo Region Assembly of Public School Councils (WRAPSC): The purpose of WRAPSC is to assist all School Councils of the WRDSB to further their support of student achievement through parent engagement. Mary Johnson's School Council requires a representative to attend the 6 WRAPSC meetings of the year. Meetings take place on the first Tuesday of the month (with January's meeting on the 2nd Tuesday).

Mary-Evelyn Lather attended the latest meeting and provided an update. There were 2 presentations. The first was by a public health nurse about alcohol abuse among youth, including a list of resources. The other presentation was from three board employees about the revised health curriculum. Parents are encouraged to read the curriculum itself as well as the parent guides provided by the Board. The Board Policy on religious accommodation encourages honoring student's religious beliefs by seeking ways to include (rather than exclude) students in the new curriculum.
