•	Traffic, Parking & Bus Safety Audit [5 min]	 Transportation Department personnel have been out to observe again and now are engaging with City Staff. We are currently collecting data on students' personal transportation modes for Transportation Department. Tim believes it's actually worse after Karen Bileski's attempts to improve. By-law and transportation will be coming to look at some of their potential interventions.
•	Fencing at front of school – Safety [15 min]	 Process: 3 steps for approval. Need letters of support to explain concerns (as a community) Wondering if fence is an appropriate solution to avoid a potentially dangerous situation. Isn't sure if there's another or better option to help stem this; especially with no decrease in vehicles at pick-up. Hareish wonders if Brynhurst could be closed off am/pm (or at least pm).
•	Police Checks → Comm & Ed Process (10 min)	 [Compliance / Necessity / Process] January start date (NFL already requires this) Volunteers are typically people who are known for years, don't ask for it. Field trip overhaul from Tim already in process (much more order/volunteer call/due-diligence) 10 dollars if there is a written note from a principal (40 dollars otherwise)(will be tricky to recruit?) Kirsten noted it doesn't HAVE to be renewed each year Some council members concerned that the blanket requirement would be debilitating to recruitment issues. Not being able to host events because of this - income concerns?
