The next local Blood Donor Clinic will be held October 31. With it being Halloween, this is a tough day for Canadian Blood Services to fill all of their donation time slots. However, blood products are needed for surgical patients, cancer patients, and car crash victims just the same. If you are able, please donate – the clinic will run from 2-6 pm at Steinmann Mennonite Church in Baden. There are still 40 appointments open.

We take it for granted that if we were in get into a serious car accident that the blood needed to save us would be there. However, blood is only available because someone took an hour out of his or her day to donate. Only 4% of those who are eligible to donate actually do so. And that percentage is dropping in Canada and throughout the developed nations.

Our PFL number can be used by anyone, anywhere in Canada (except Quebec) so please encourage family, neighbours and friends too!

To all those who have donated so far this year – thank you! We only need seven more donations to reach our target of 40 but it would be great to exceed our goal! It's especially exciting to see four new donors who are now giving blood.

To save time when donating you can now complete the first part of the donor questionnaire before you arrive at the clinic, if you have an appointment and Canadian Blood Services has your email address on file.

I recently had the privilege of attending the Canadian Blood Services awards ceremony in Ottawa. It was a very inspiring two-day event. One of the speakers shared a quote by John F. Kennedy that seems to sum things up: "If not you, who? If not now, when?"
