## 3. Principals Report

- The present student population is 176.
- New Staff, 2 ECE's (early childhood educator), 1 EA (educational assistant) and Ms. Lernout who is the drama teacher.
- Team Approach
  - The teachers and administration work as a team to try and construct a positive relationship with parents and have the best outcome for students.
  - Encourage parents to work with the classroom teacher to resolve any challenges first, before bringing things to the Principal.
- Trees / Basketball nets
  - The maple trees that were removed from the playground were confirmed to be diseased and were a hazard to student safety.
  - o New trees will be planted some time into the future.
  - New basketball nets are being investigated for future playground improvements. Costs for these improvements will be brought to a future school council meeting.
- The website School-Day will still be the primary means of communication with the parent community.
- Planners
  - The company which is responsible for supplying the student planners had a turnover of staff through the summer and the books were misprinted.
  - The end result is that a different company is now publishing replacement books. The planners will be distributed when they arrive.
- Terry Fox Run, September 26<sup>th</sup>
  - o Mr. Heer started announcements advertising the run.
  - o Students are encouraged to bring a toonie as a donation for the Terry Fox foundation.
  - The run takes place during the middle block.
  - The goal for the school is to raise \$500.

## 4. School Council Finances
