Principal Updates - Marc

- Student Learning: first weeks of acclimating to new routines, expectations and learning spaces for the year, structured literacy approach in motion -Board's response to the OHR Right to Read Inquiry Report
- Staffing: two new supervision monitors have been hired for our three Kindergarten classes and to fill in some supervision timetable gaps; grade 1/2 position being temporarily filled by two occasional teachers
- Potential teacher job action/strike may be forthcoming
- Health & Safety: three fire drills have taken place with a lockdown drill planned for Friday. The students have been great with a record 3.5 minutes exit time and accounted for during our last drill. Workplace Inspection Team continues to do monthly inspections. The WIT is composed of Marc, the head custodian and two teachers
- Facility/Grounds: playground conversations are still in the works with Marc awaiting a
 response from Facilites to potentially alleviate some of the costs. The parking lot and
 tarmac were not paved this summer with budgetary constraints being cited as the
 reason. Marc is also still awaiting a response from Facilities for a basketball post quote..
 The Gaga Ball pit has been very popular and is very much appreciated by our students.
- New break schedule: we have switched to eating first followed by outdoor play. This
 schedule has been working well and assists our head custodian with cleaning
- Strong Start-Letters Sounds and Words program. Seeking interested parties and possible coordinator
- Mad Science after school program will take place beginning Oct. 25 for 8 weeks. Kick-off assembly will be Oct. 4
- Spiritwear and logo design: Marc has a company working on an online webstore for our staff and students. The WRDSB Comms department is also assisting with designing a fresh logo for our Panda that can hopefully be used in future stationery, clothing and other graphics

Classroom Allocation (field trips, classroom supplies, etc.) -Lindsay

Outdoor Education Field Trips -Lindsay

- Proposal put forward to have one primary and one junior grade attending each year in order to maintain outdoor education trips.
- All were in favour of this proposal.
