7:03 pm Meeting Open and Welcome

7:04 pm Introduction of Diane McGregor from KW Counselling

- Diane is able to come to future Coffee Connections and give presentations on a range of parenting topics and specific issues; lead small group discussions; Q&A; discuss skills and strategies.
- These meetings will be more conversation-oriented rather than presentation-oriented, and parents would be encouraged to learn from each other to create community and connections.
- KW Counselling uses "Parenting with Passion", similar to our "Tools for Life".
- The cost is typically \$400 for a 2-hour presentation, but this can be tailored to our school's needs, and there may be community grants available.
- Meetings will take place in the Library, from approx. 9:15-10:15am.
- It's possible that the Grade 6 class could offer a planned child care program, in the Community Hub (room 15), as a part of their curriculum, and to meet our childcare needs.
- Hot topics could include: handling big emotions; defiance; navigating
 relationships; discipline. Potty training was mentioned as a possible topic, Diane
 recommends that we contact the Early Years Centre, as they are better equipped to
 help us, and are also free. Our Place was also mentioned as another community
 resource that is available.

7:22 pm Chair's Report

- Parent volunteers have been active in the school, putting new paper up on bulletin boards, cleaning and organizing rooms around the school. Thank you to our voluteers!
- The Community Hub (Room 15) is a shared space in our school, which houses the Extended Day program, Strong Start, Milk, Nutrition for Learning, Home Reading, Fundraising, etc. It is also being used by some of our Room 10 students as a lunch room. We have made progress in organizing this room, but there is still more to be done. Possibly leaving out a bowl of extra NFL (Nutrition for Learning) snacks was mentioned.
- The Resource Room (Room 19) has been put on hold for now. This room is typically kept locked, but is being used by a variety of people and classes (Room 2 students, speech pathology, etc).
- The Math Room is currently being used by our kindergarten students for small group instruction. EIEI is also using the room for small groups.

7:30 pm Principal's Report

- Our Spec-Ed team has been working to organize Coffee Connections topics and dates. The first meetings will cover: head lice; toilet training; speech pathology tools and how parents can help; Tools for Life; and creating children's work spaces in the home. Dates to be announced.
- NFL (Nutrition for Learning) is up and running smoothly.
- Milk and Pizza are also on the go. There are many parents that are willing to help with Pizza -- thank you to our volunteers!
- Home Reading Program is up and running. We are looking for parent volunteers to come in and help -- either half an hour after drop-off, or half an hour near the end of the day -- to help monitor students, track books and help in book selection. A few parents volunteered to do so, if you are also wanting to help, contact the Principal or a Council Member.
- Mrs. Bateman has requested that a parent voluteer make playdough for her classroom. Angela Wenderoth voluteered to do so.
- The Spec-Ed teachers have been advocating strongly for our students who have special learning needs, so that they will get the proper support.

7:37 pm Labour Relations

- We understand that there is frustration all around, while trying to deal with head lice and job action from custodians and teachers. We need to be patient and look for ways that we can help each other. We don't know what the coming weeks will look like.
- On October 28th, the teachers will be withdrawing all extra-curricular activities. Remembrance Day activities will be unaffected. The Christmas Concert is tentative but possible, as the teachers are waiting for direction. It may possibly happen during the day. The Bake Sale will go on regardless, scheduled for December 8th and 9th.
- The Ontario Premier and the Minister of Education have announced that as of November 1st, one of two things must happen:
 - 1. A tentative agreement must be reached and all job action must stop
 - 2. All job action must stop while labour discussions continue
- If one of those things does not happen, the School Board will have the power to respond to job action (possibly docking teacher's pay, etc).

- Prueter will have a new policy of no dogs on the school grounds during school hours, including before and after school drop-off and pick-up times.
