2. Teacher Report-Alison Cass:

- Home Reading the primary and junior students are really enjoying the Home Reading program and there is lots of hype

- Remembrance Day ceremony was today and there was a great feeling of respect in the assembly
- Tuck Shop has been going really well

3. MacMillians Fundraising:

5. Principal's Report:

- Turkey Lunch volunteers needed for Dec. 4th. There is a possibility of getting chafing dishes from Rockway Mennonite Collegiate. Lexington P.S. and Mrs. Chatha's father have made donations to the Turkey Lunch. Trying to think of other ways to incorporate the silver theme into the 25th Anniversary
- Greening Project work has begun! They are hoping to have a majority of the work completed by the end of November
