- Discussed what schools have spent fundraised money on:

 - Outdoor equipment
 - Musical equipment e.g. ukuleles, recorders
- Covered what schools may not spend fundraised money on: Technology such as Chromebooks Teacher Appreciation items
- What teachers would wish money to be spent on: New/changes to home reading books New/changes to books for classrooms, especially equity-based books

Fundraising Report:

- The kindie playground in front of the school has been deemed in need of replacement. Fundraising dedicated to paying for this will begin soon. Preliminary estimates suggest the cost will be between \$25,000 and \$30,000.
